During a visit to Madison, I made an appointment with the head of the tax division. He was very kind and helpful, but only on the recent stamps. I was surprised that there were no former issues to show me as every one not used was destroyed. Even the State Historical Society did not get any for a collection or historical purposes. The Department's tax structure has changed several times over a period of years and each head had his own ideas as to tax collection methods and made a new start - with new stamps.

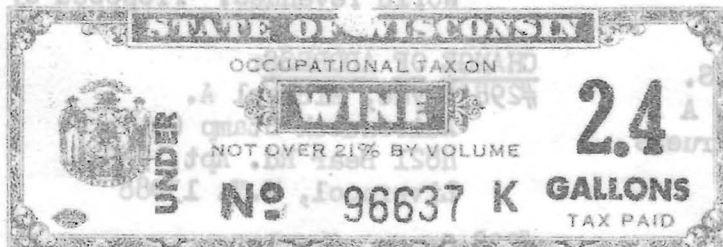
The following stamps are current:

Liquor - All are decals. First color(s) refers to top panel.  
second color to bottom panel.

- 2 oz tan on black and green
- 4 oz blue on black and green
- 1/2 pint green on black and orange
- 1 pint yellow and blue
- 1/10 gal red and orange
- 1/5 gal blue and yellow
- 1 quart orange and red

1/2 gal red and blue - This stamp was prepared but never used. It exists only as a proof without serial number and will never be available to collectors.

(At least some of the liquor stamps exist with two sizes of serial numbers. Presumably the current issue has smaller 9-digit numbers but less-used sizes may occur only with the 8-digit numbers. See July 1972 Newsletter).



### Wine Case Stamps

Red on yellow for wine over 14%:

- 1.5 gal.
- 2.4 gal.
- 3.0 gal.
- 4.0 gal.

Green on green - under 14%:

- 1.5 gal.
- 2.4 gal.
- 3.0 gal.
- 4.0 gal.

Very few of the 1.5 gallon stamps are used. They are primarily for cases of small bottles of either local or imported wine. (Cont. page 20)

A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Now that I've been elected President of the State Revenue Society a personal introduction would appear to be in order. I was born and raised in Ogden, Utah and spent most of my younger years on a farm. As a young lad I'd always had a desire to see exotic and far away lands so shortly after my graduation from high school I joined the Navy to "see the world". After my initial hitch I attempted to pursue a college education but in the ensuing two years after my initial release decided to return to the Navy, this time with a career in mind. I'm happy to say that after thirteen years of enjoyable service it was the right decision.

Unlike some collectors I was what you could call a late bloomer to the hobby. In my earlier years I had but one encounter with the world of philately this being at the age of 12. I invested a months allowance in 50 exotic "sand-dune" specials which I stuck in a five and dime note pad, being totally ignorant of what a hinge was, much less what it was used for. My duties with the Navy brought me to Seattle, Washington in 1965 and this was where my interests in stamps really began to take form. I purchased a beginner's U.S. album from a local department store and embarked on surmounting myself a collection, but I soon lost interest in this aspect of the hobby. I almost stopped collecting altogether until a fellow Navy man, Stan Schur (now retired), introduced me to the fascinating world of state revenues. Mr. Schur was also instrumental in my joining the local revenue collectors club and the SRS.

It was through the SRS I began to enlarge my collection via correspondence which has continued to grow as has my collection with each passing year. I've made several friends through this media of communication, many of which motivated me to assisting in the preparation of a catalog on the revenue stamps of Washington state.

In closing I would like to thank all the members who voted me into this office and to say that during the following two years I plan to adopt what I've called an "open door" policy. That is, I want all members to feel free to contact me any time they think I or the other members of the board could be of assistance.

I think I can speak for the other members of the Board as well as myself in saying that we hope to have even a bigger and better SRS than before and solicit your help and assistance in making this come true.

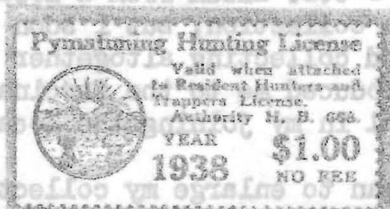

Pymatuning Lake Waterfowl Hunting Stamps

Pymatuning Lake (reservoir) is located on the Ohio-Pennsylvania border with portions extending into both states. Effective 18 May 1937 Ohio passed an act (HB668) granting reciprocal waterfowl hunting privileges to Pennsylvania hunters and fishing rights to holders of valid Pennsylvania licenses. It is assumed Pennsylvania passed a similar reciprocal act on or about the same date.

The state of Ohio repealed the act on 2 May 1945.



1938 \$1.00 black on yellow. State seal and printed text. Approx 50 x 27 mm overall. Perf 12½. No serial numbers.

The Ohio Division of Wildlife states no records of stamp usage now exists. Information on Ohio stamps other than 1938 or of any possible similar Pennsylvania issues is solicited.

Wildlife Conservation Stamps

These are not a license stamp. Purchase is not required for any hunting, fishing or outdoor activity and they do not provide any privileges to the purchaser. However, they are sold by the Division of Wildlife and funds received are used to acquire and maintain wildlife habitat. First sold in 1972 and additional stamps planned for future years.

1972 \$5.00 multicolored. Pair of cardinals (Ohio State bird) in winter scene. Designer: Susan Watts.

2¢ red - 2, 4, or 8 oz.

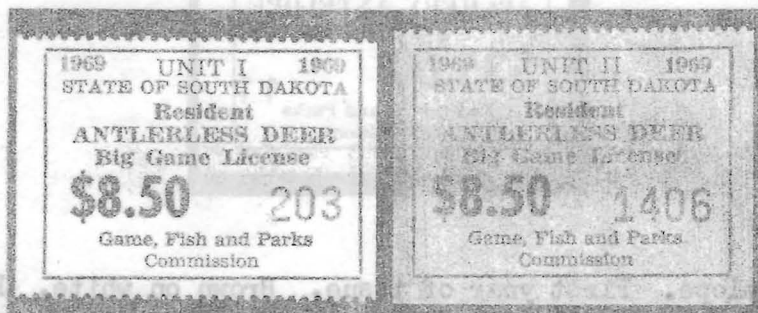

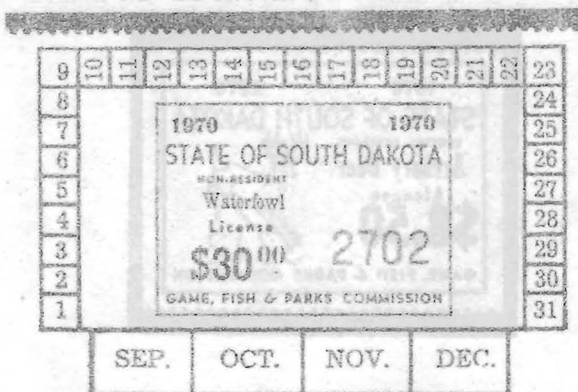

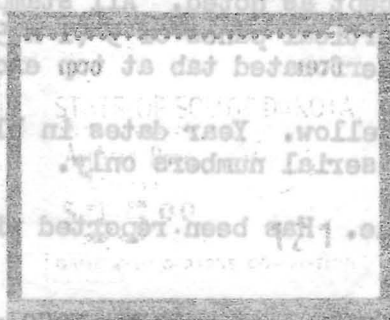

\$35.00 West River Prairie Deer. Black on deep yellow. Has been reported with 4 mm Gothic type serial numbers only.



\$35.00 Archery Deer. Green on white. Valid statewide. Separate East River and West River Archery Deer stamps were not issued. Has been reported with 4 mm Gothic type serial numbers only.

\$35.00 Archery Antelope. Black on pink. Has been reported with  $4\frac{1}{2}$  mm Gothic type serial numbers only.

MISSISSIPPI BEER - Charles Hermann reports discovery of some unlisted items:

\$6.62 green - like \$6.82 blue of addenda

40¢ green and orange on yellow (perforated) - like BW5 & 6. List this as BW4A

40¢ green and orange on yellow. 40¢ at bottom center like BW12. Roul 6  $\frac{3}{4}$  on 3 sides. List this as BW11A

80¢ like BW12 except perf  $11\frac{1}{2}$  x 12. List as BW12a

1923 First Reengraving

There is yet another constant difference which separates most of the first reengraving from the original issue. There is no sun or rays above the mountain on any of the original issue. But one can tell the reengravings are later because the sun has risen! (Fig. 83). All of the cent values, the \$1 denomination, and later the \$1000 stamp show the sun. The other dollar values did not get the sun and rays at any time.

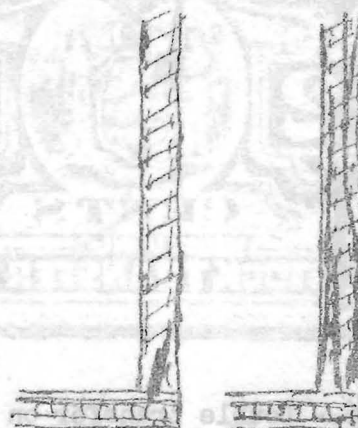


Fig. 84.- Reengraved 2¢ of 1923 showing right frame without recutting (left) and representative recut right frame (right).

The 2¢ without some recutting on the right frame is not known in multiple. The die was apparently recut except for the right frame which was recut directly on the plate so that each stamp is somewhat different in the right frame. Fig. 84 diagrammatically shows the original state prior to recutting with right frame consisting of mostly diagonal lines as compared to a typical recut variety with strong longitudinal lines added. The variety without right frame recut is believed to exist from only a few positions on the plate.

Three double transfers are known on the 2¢ (Figs. 85-87). All have the right frame recut.

We have not found any plate varieties on the 4¢.

The 10¢ was first printed in a light olive and later in bright green. Only the early printings of the olive green come without recut frames (Fig. 88). The recutting on the 10¢ is of heavy lines on all four frames. Two positions on the plate are found without recutting on left frame and one not recut at right. They are interesting varieties and come in both colors.

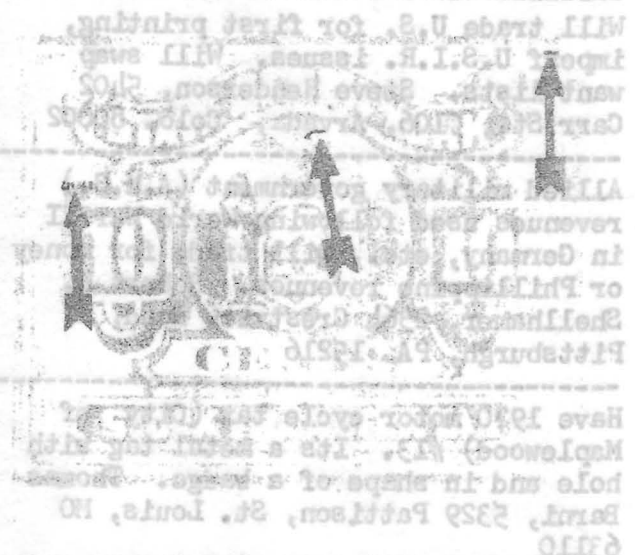


Fig. 91.- Double transfer upper right, above eagle's wing, and above left value panel on 10¢ reengraved.
