FLORIDA UPDATE

Several years ago Florida introduced a new series of documentary stamps that do not bear the signature of the State Comptroller. Thus, they do not have to be changed each time a new Comptroller comes into office. The new stamps are printed in panes of 50, 5 by 10. Black sheet numbers appear in the margin(fig. 1). Aside from the elimination of the Comptroller's signature, the design is similar to that of earlier Florida documentary stamps. Ten values are now in use: 5¢ gold; 15¢ blue; 30¢ orange; 75¢ apple green; \$1 blue green; \$3 lilac; \$5 green; \$10 purple; \$25 light red; \$100 brown. All values are perf. 11.

Documentary sur-tax stamps were introduced in 1968. At that time they were issued by the Comptroller's office. About the middle of 1969 the issuance of these stamps was taken over by the Florida Department of Revenue. Stamps issued by the Comptroller's office bore that office's seal in the design. The later issues of the Department of Revenue show the Florida State Seal. Examples of both designs are shown in Figure 2. All five denominations have been issued in both designs. The values are 55¢; \$1.10; \$5.50; \$11.00; \$110.00. All seen so far are silver grey on white paper and are perf. 12 1/2.

Meters are still used by the various Florida counties to collect both the documentary and the sur-tax. Illustrated in Figure 3 are two previously unreported types from Sarasota County.

Admission fees for parks, movies, museums, etc. in Florida are subject to a state sales tax. The amount of the tax is indicated on the ticket, as shown in Figure 4. These tickets are thus similar to the Ohio sales tax receipts except that in Florida each individual place of business prints its own.

Collectors can obtain mint copies of any denomination of Florida Documentary or Documentary sur-tax stamps from me at face value plus a self-addressed, stamped envelope or 15¢ postage. My NEW address is on the mast-head. Orders will be accumulated for one month following the arrival of this issue of the NEWSLETTER. At that point I'll place a mass order with the state and forward the stamps as soon as they arrive.



ARIZONA MALT LIQUOR STAMPS

Massachusetts	Waterfowl	Also has sold archery deer stamps since 1960.

Mississippi	Conservation Stamp	Lest any member believe this to be a regular revenue or tax stamp to pay for any commodity or service, such is not the case. These are not required to hunt, fish or pursue any activity and voluntary purchase is about comparable to buying Christmas seals—your money goes for a good cause. Mississippi did issue a \$2 card in 1976 to hunt migratory waterfowl and followed with stamps for the 1977-78 and 1978-79 seasons.

LICENSE PLATE COLLECTORS

All of us, at one time or another. have eyed an auto license plate with the realization that that hunk of tin really is a state revenue just as much as is a New York stock transfer stamp. This realization is usually quickly followed by the thought "But nd all thoughts of collecting license plates vanish. For most people, that is, but not for the members of the Automobile License Plate Collectors Association. This organization. founded in 1954, now has over 1250 members. All are collectors of license plates and the emphasis is on state plates but foreign issues are not ignored.

The ALPCA publishes a bimonthly newsletter, 32 pages per issue. It contains articles on license plates of specific states, new issue news, and members' offers to buy, sell and trade. Validating stickers also receive attention as do local plates. Obviously there is overlap here betwee the interests of some SRS members and ALPCA. Dues are \$12 per year(\$16 if the Newsletter is mailed first class) and applications are available from the Secretary/Treasurer: Gary Brent Kincade, 207 Springdale Avenue, Beckley, West Virginia 25801. 









Member Doug Eastoe sends along two examples of Province of Saskatchewan driver's licenses depicting a change in the method of validating these documents. The 1973-1974 issue requires a separate stamp be affixed to the face of the license indicating its validity. By 1975 the stamp was no longer used and in its place appears a printed version of the same seal with the word "validated" beneath it. Both examples are printed in lavender on whitish stock with the validation stamp in the same color but on bright white paper.

NEW SERIES OF WISCONSIN LIQUOR STAMPS

The Wisconsin Department of Revenue has begun to issue a new series of "special liquor tax" stamps to reflect a lower rate of tax for certain types of distilled spirits. Since 1971 the rate of tax for distilled spirits has been \$2.60 per gallon. In order to encourage use of certain types of waste materials for fermentation and distillation, a new \$1 per gallon tax has been instituted in place of the usual \$2.60 tax. The new lower tax applies to distilled spirits derived from the following wastes:

- a. Brewery wastes
- b. Whey which is the liquid waste from the production of cheese
- c. Other wastes from pollution control facilities

The tax rate only applies if the wastes used were derived from Wisconsin sources and if the distilled spirits are manufactured or distilled in Wisconsin.

Even though the stamps have been authorized since August 20, 1977, they have only recently made their appearance on liquor bottles. Until January 1, 1979 taxpayers have been permitted to use the standard Wisconsin stamps and apply for a rebate for the tax differential. However, this practice was ended when a new regulation of the Department of Revenue went into effect requiring the use of the special liquor tax stamps if the lower rate was to be claimed. As a result, stamps like the one illustrated have made their appearance in a number of metric and English denominations.
