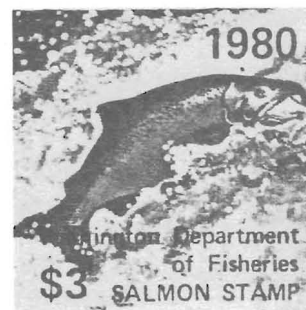
WASHINGTON STATE SALMON STAMPS

Since 1978 Washington State has issued annually a set of four salmon stamps with face values of \$1, \$3, \$5 and \$10. For each year, all four values are of the same design, although the colors vary from value to value. The designs of the 1978, 1979 and 1980 stamps are shown here. Colors for these years are as follows:

The 1978 and 1979 stamps are rouletted 9 1/2. The 1980 stamps are also rouletted 9 1/2 between stamps, but are die cut within the rouletting. All stamps are printed with pressure sensitive gum in sheets of 25.



Each value pays a specific license fee as follows:

THE "NATURAL" WISCONSIN BEER STAMP MYSTERY

The "NATURAL" Wisconsin beer stamp has aroused my curiosity ever since I learned of its existence. About four years ago, I bought a nice grouping of state revenues and you can imagine how excited I was when I found this stamp with its handstamped overprint mixed in with the other Wisconsin material!

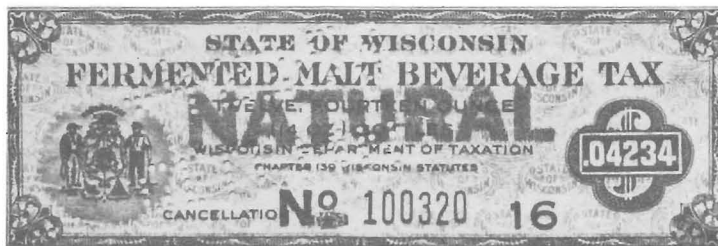

The basic stamp is a violet \$.04234 beer stamp (B90) which was used on cartons of twelve 14 oz. bottles. My stamp is the only one which I have seen with the red overprint. The only other mention of the handstamp of which I am aware is listed in Hubbard's 1960 State Revenue Catalog. He reported he had seen a copy of the carmine \$.07258 beer stamp (B92a) with a "black handstamped 'NATURAL' in 6 1/2 x 7 mm block letters". It would appear that the same stamping device was used on both stamps. However, the most interesting part and that which made me most curious is that Hubbard does not list this item as a beer stamp but as a wine stamp (W39)!

Until I acquired my stamp, I had no reason to question Hubbard's assessment of its use; after all, overprinting a stamp for a use other than its original one is not unusual. My new stamp changed all that; for right in the middle of it was a punch cancel (figure 2) of the Gettelman Brewing Company of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and I had never heard of them being involved in the wine business. So, what kind of product was it used for? Wine? Beer? Specialty item? Did it indicate a special tax rate?

Recently, I had two lucky breaks in my search. The first was finding a Gettelman label (Figure 3) at a dealer's table. The words "Natural Process" are what really caught my attention and gave me my first inkling that the stamp overprint was not an official government one but probably a private one for non-revenue purposes.

My second break came during a visit to the Stevens Point Brewery. I was talking with the owner and his son and I showed them my stamp. They were unfamiliar with the overprint but suggested I contact Mr. Fritz Gettelman, who was now working for a Milwaukee malt company since the sale of the Gettelman Brewery. I telephoned him and in the course of a very pleasant conversation, Mr. Gettelman confirmed what I had already suspected. The brewery had used the overprint to distinguish their "Natural Process" beers from other beers and also to cancel the stamp. One might almost call it a form of advertising. The overprint was not to satisfy any special provisions in the tax laws; that is, for a special tax rate or special category. It definitely did not indicate a wine use.

In conclusion, the listing of this stamp as a wine stamp should be discontinued. If this type of overprinting were a common occurrence practiced throughout the beer industry, I would not consider listing it in the new ARA revenue catalog. Since it is a unique use limited to one brewery and is uncommon, the overprinted stamp will be listed as a sub-variety of the beer stamp on which it appears. This should prevent any confusion in the future. If anyone has any other copies of this overprint, please contact me at 110 LeTendre Avenue, Port Edwards, WI 54469. I would like to know the Hubbard number of the basic stamp and the color and letter size of the hand-stamped overprint.

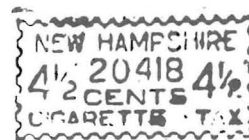

Figure 8 is double stamped (and has not reproduced too well because of a faint original). James Nichols reports that the meter is counterfit. They were confiscated in police raids in October, 1979, then restamped with a decal and sold at auction to the highest bidder.

1980 MASSACHUSETTS ARCHERY STAMP

The 1980 Massachusetts archery stamp was released in mid-October. The illustrated stamp is printed in brown on a grey-blue background. Unlike previous years' issues, the 1980 stamp bears the addition inscription "PRIMITIVE FIREARMS". According to the state, this reflects a change in the law such that hunters using primitive firearms must also pay an additional \$5.10 fee. The exact definition of "primitive firearms" is not clear. These stamps are available at face value from the Massachusetts Division of Fisheries and Game, 100 Cambridge Street, Boston, MA 02202.

DUCK STAMP ARTIST "TOOK A GAMBLE"

Hastings wildlife artist Terry Redlin "took a gamble with his entry in Minnesota's fourth annual Migratory Waterfowl Stamp competition--he put neck and leg bands on one of the giant Canadian geese in his painting."

There were times, Redlin said Thursday, when he felt those bands might "blow me right out of the judging." But he had noticed them in many of the 600 photos of Canadian geese he took before beginning his painting and hoped "the judges would recognize their importance in documenting the life histories of these geese."

The judges did and Redlin was named the 1981 winner. He tied for first with David Maass of Waterville last year, then was awarded second on a tie-breaker vote, and tied for fifth in previous competitions.



The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) will print 250,000 stamps based on Redlin's painting. They will go on sale February 15, priced at \$3, at the DNR License Center and licensing agencies throughout the state.

Persons hunting waterfowl on other than their own land must buy a stamp. The proceeds (\$1.5 million to date) are used to create and improve state wetlands and waterfowl lakes.

As the winning artist, Redlin has the exclusive right to reproduce a limited edition of this 6 x 9 inch painting, some 3,000 to 4,000 prints. At \$125 each, he said, "most of them are pre-sold to collectors." The rest will go to the 75 or so galleries in the country that now exhibit Redlin's works.

Redlin, 43, a Hastings resident since 1970, grew up in Watertown, S.D., studied art in St. Paul and worked at Brown & Bigelow and the Webb Co., where he was the magazine art director, before turning full-time to what had always been his first interest, wildlife painting, two years ago.

He spent two weeks on his stamp painting, he said, split between actual painting and research. The latter took him to Rochester, where a few Canadian geese, believed nearly extinct 20 years ago, were found alive and well at the city's Silver Lake in 1962. Now thousands pause there each year on their migratory flights and many never leave Rochester.

The annual stamp competition drew 168 entries this year, up from 109 a year ago. It is limited to artists living in Minnesota. Daniel Smith, Minneapolis, placed second with a painting of snow geese. Third went to Phil Scholer, Kasson, who also depicted Canadians.

FISH AND GAME--OFFICIAL AND UNOFFICIAL

First let me say that I specialize in state duck stamps and thought the following information may be helpful to those other SRS members who also collect the state ducks.

The state of Arkansas is **issuing** a state duck stamp for 1981 which will go on sale July 1, 1981 at a cost of \$5.50. Reknowned artist Lee LeBlanc is doing the artwork for the first stamp. He was commissioned by Arkansas to do the stamp.

The status of the Ohio duck stamp is still in limbo. - It hasn't been officially passed in the legislature yet although the state has already commissioned John Ruthven to do the design for the stamp. The artwork is completed and features Wood Ducks. It is a matter of waiting until Ohio officially passes it before it becomes a reality.

Many other states have legislation pending on the issuance of state stamps for waterfowl hunters but as of this date no new issues have been approved.

For those interested many new organizations are following Ducks Unlimited in organizing themselves. Groups recently begun and issuing stamps that they sell for raising revenue for their work are as follows:

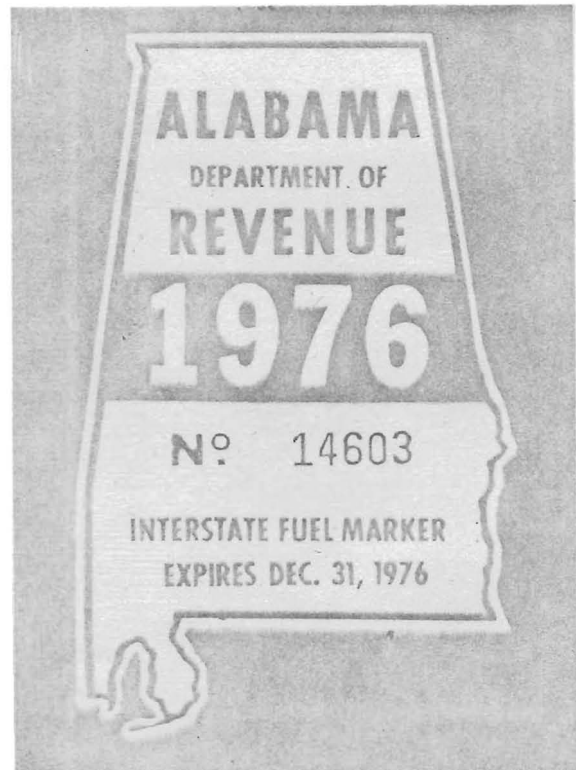
