# NEW YORK BEDDING STAMPS

Illustrated are the upper left and lower left corner blocks of 4 of the 1937 New York bedding stamp, Hubbard #315. The number on the upper left block is not a plate number. It is printed in bright red and appears to be some sort of serial number. The Nature of the mark on the lower left block is not known. It is in the color of the stamps themselves and appeared on all of the several sheets of these seen. Sheet format on these dark blue on white stamps is 10 x 10, with selvage all around.

### OREGON CIGARETTE STAMPS

Forty-two years is a long time in anyone's book. But that is how long, from the initial bill in 1924, it took the Oregon State Legislature and/or voters to get a cigarette tax law into effect. Oregon was one of the last, if not the last, states to pass such a law in 1966.

The sponsors and pro-tax people came so close on two prior occasions, in 1947 and 1963, that passage seemed almost a certainty.

In 1947 the administration was so certain of approval that they authorized the printing of eleven million water decals. What's that about counting your chicks before they hatch? These are a .02 blue, on a light-weight yellow card, ll x 14 mm., imperforate with a black roulette 8 between the panes. Use of this decal was to begin on July 5 but was killed by referendum at the last minute. Still, per the law, it had to go to the voters in October for the final say. When the votes were talled, the electroate turned thumbs down on the proposed tax. For a number of years collectors could buy these items at face value and many collections today hold singles or multiples of this unissued item.




Early in 1963 the state's House of Representatives handed the protax people another defeat. Representative Victor Atiyeh, a Beaverton Republican and the bill's sponsor, said "that Oregeon is the only state in the nation that does not levy such a tax." He then submitted a bill for a tax of \$.04 per pack with the proposed tax to be paid by means of stamps or meter impressions. Hopes ran very high for the bill's passage. But there was evidently no attempt to have the \$.04 stamp printed as had happened in 1947. Assuredly in this case one set of burnt fingers was an apt teacher. But, with the proposal going down in defeat in a 33-26 vote on the floor of the House of Representatives, the pro-tax forces immediately laid plans for a future try against the voter's distaste of all taxation.

Final approval came in 1966, to become effective at 8 a.m. Pacific Standard Time on July 1. In all likelihood, the big-spending politicians were happy.



Of the three authorized decals, or heat transfers, issued and used in Oregon this is by far the most common. Imperforate, ll x ll mm., with slightly scalloped edges the decal is black on an olive-green background on white paper, with "OREGON" in white. Cancelled in red, with the words "OREGON STATE" in horizontal staggered lines about 1 mm. apart, these

Concurrently with the decal, a cigarette Pitney-Bowes meter stamp was authorized for use on a pack of cigarettes as well as upon a ten-pack carton.



This is printed in either a red/orange or a purple--the last might be considered a very dark blue--outline, 32 x 14 mm. simulated perfs., and reads, in three lines, "OREGON/20(Pitney-Bowes No.) 20/CIGARETTE TAX". It was to be applied to the bottom of the pack in the same area as the decal, and at one time somewhere on the carton of cigarettes.

Two other items were also used, but are not seen as often as those mentioned previously.

For those over-sized packages of 20 cigarettes which cannot be accomodated by the stamping machinery the above water decal is used, being hand applied to the pack. It is red on a green background with "OREGON" and "20 CIGARETTES"being in white.



Some cigarettes sold in Oregon are packaged with half the normal amount of 20 cigarettes. For these a water decal is used applied to the pack by hand. It is similar to the one listed above but red in color. It bears the figure "10" to indicate one half the standard tax rate. My copy of this came from a pack of imported cigarettes.

Though one cannot legally obtain any of these items from either the state or the distributor, the one way open to obtain these tax indicia is to simply purchase four different packs of cigarettes in, or from, Oregon that bear one of the samples.

# Cigarette Decals

The correct name for these items is "decalcomania transfers", or water stamps, but are generally called "decals" for short.

A decal is simply a built up coat of lacquer or paint which slides off the backing card when wet and will adhere to cellophane, glass or other slick surfaces to which ordinary gummed paper stamps will not adhere.

These are normally prepared in rolls of 30,000 and then applied, one by one, to the pack's cellophane wrapping with a Meyercord heat fusion machine.

# Meter Stamps

These are Pitney-Bowes meters which were also applied to the carton in place of decals. It must be remembered that each and every Pitney-Bowes meter will show a different meter number. Thus the number of different impressions that may be collected may be quite large.

To date 10 different numbers have been reported: 41500, 41503, 41506, 41508, 41511, 41512, 41514 all in red/orange, 41516 purple, 41532 red/orange, and 41537 purple. However, Harold A. Effner, Jr. believes there should be a total of 40 number authorized for use. Can anyone add to the total?

Each meter is from a plate of 10 imprints all of which have the same number. So if a digarette distributor has but one machine, all the stamps will have but one number.

# Prescribed Law for Their Use

Per the 1971 state law, Chapter 323, section 323.160, we read that he "Department shall prescribe by regulation the method and manner in which stamps or meters are to be affixed to packages of cigarettes and may provide for the cancellation of stamps or meter impressions. An appropriate stamp shall be affixed to, or an appropriate meter impression shall be made on, each package of cigarettes prior to the distribution of the cigarettes."

Though the law does not state where the stamps or meters are to be acquired another source of information enlightens us. In an August 15, 1980 letter to Harold A. Effner, Jr. from the Oregon Department of Revenue, it states that: "All the stamps we use in Oregon are manufactured by the Meyercord Corporation in Carol Stream, Illinois. The meter is manufactured by the Pitney-Bowes Corporation."

# Stamp Distribution and Use

The tax on cigarettes to be sold has to be paid by the distributors prior to the sale of the cigarettes, and then in turn is collected as part of the retail price of the pack or carton. The Department furnishes the stamps and approves meter settings for the metering machines.

A strict accountability of the meter machines is required. No meter, meter register setting or unaffixed stamps are "to be sold, exchanged, or in any manner transferred by the distributor to another person without prior approval of the department." Only licensed distributors are permitted to buy stamps and meters; payment being due at the time of purchase.

The distributor has to authorize in writing, who can order stamps or meter settings against his account. This authorization remains effective until written revocation is received by the department.

The distributor receives compensation for applying the stamp or meter impressions at the rate of \$.00167 per package of cigarettes. But, for the privilege of holding or storing cigarettes for sale, use or consumption, a floor tax was imposed September 9, 1971 at the rate of 2 1/2 mills(\$.0025). At the same time every distributor had to pay a tax of 4 1/2 mills(\$.0045) for the distributions of each package in the state. Both these taxes were only upon those cigarettes bought for distribution after the passage of the 1971 act.

All monies received from the cigarette tax were disposed in such a way that 50% is credited to the General Fund for general governmental purposes. Of the balance, 25% went to the state's cities and 25% to the state's counties based on the density of population at the last census. The funds are distributed quarterly in January, April, July and October.

# After Thoughts

Doug Owen, head tobacconist at The Tinder Box, Tigert, Oregon has informed me there is no tax collected on pipe tobacco, cigars, chewing tobacco or snuff. The one exception he has noted is in regard to the tenpack cigarette-sized cigars. Here he has observed one specifically named pack has a 10-count stamp on them while the remainder do not. He had no explanation for this enigma except that possibly: (a) the tax office in Salem was uncertain on how the tax rules should be interpreted, or (b) the cigar/cigarette distributors in Los Angeles where most of the shop's stock comes from, was confused as to what items should or should not be assessed the tax. As I have to date, found no reference within the state's tobacco laws on this matter I would like to know why some packs of cigarette-sized cigars should carry the red seal while most do not.

Doug also said that the tax inspectors were constantly dropping by to be sure that the tax stamps are attached to the cigarette packs. On one occasion an inspector went directly to the shop's enclosed area containing the cigars. After his inspection he asked where the state's tax stamps were that were supposed to be attached to the boxes of cigars. The inspector seemed nonplussed upon being told that cigars did not require a tax stamp.

In another shop I was told that the tax stamps were actually a "pain" due to their tendency to fall off the packs.

There are no cities or counties in Oregon which have their own stamps or meters, and never have. All cigarette taxes in Oregon are controlled by the State Department of Revenue.

In 1965 Oregonians paid no tax on a pack of cigarettes; in mid-1967 it was \$.04; while on September 9, 1971 it went to \$.09. At this rate of inflated tax would the Oregon voters looking back retrospectively still vote the tax in? But Washingtonian's evidently like it as many If them cross the Columbia River to buy cigarettes which are assessed a lower rate than in their own state.

# A NEW TEXAS PERMIT

Below is reproduced the basic information on the 1982 Aoudad Sheep hunt in Caprock Canyons State Park scheduled in January, 1982. In addition to the sheep feral goats are also fair game during the hunt. Besides the data below the press release included extensive instructions for filing applications, a two-page list of special rules and maps of the area where hunting would be permitted. This is the second annual hunt in this area both of which spawned a small number of permits which should become prized collector's items. The cost is \$350.00 for each applicant payable if your name is drawn.

The full text of the press release covering six sheets has been mailed to the Librarian for the SRS holdings. Copies of the entire data may be purchased for a minimum cost(see the SRS Yearbook for details of obtaining copies from the SRS Library).

# Aoudad Public Hunt, Caprock Canyons State Park

# January, 1982

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department is conducting this hunt to reduce the Aoudad Sheep population within the park. The hunt is designed to implement a biologically sound management practice. By reducing the Aoudad numbers at the park, we hope to reduce pressure on available browse species and thereby also reduce competitive pressures on the park's mule deer herd.

Caprock Canyons State Park is located approximately three miles north of Quitaque on Ranch Road 1065. The hunt area will include approximately 3,350 acres of the 13,000 acre park.

The Parks and Wildlife Department retains the right of canceling permits, altering bag limits, or stopping the hunt at any time.

Permits will be issued for a two-day and one Aoudad limit. Hunts will begin at noon on the first day and end at noon of the third day.

Dater: January 2-4, 6-8, 8-10, 10-12, 12-14, 14-16

Permits to be-issued: 49-56

# ... and a little more TEXAS treasure ...

This article stems from a <u>little</u> research into the history of Texas Game Licenses and Permits. Much more could be done but my desire to do battle with the local bureaucrats is lacking in my September years. There's too much fun to be had in just playing with my little bits of paper.

The statutory authority for Game and Fish Licenses or Permits is derived from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Code, Section 42.012, dated 1925. There have been too many amendments and additions since them to attempt to list them all. The first Resident Hunting Permits were authorized and issued in 1925 at a cost of \$2.15. There have been two other price increases in the past 55 years. The first in 1957 raised the price to \$3.15 and the current rate of \$5.25 imposed in 1973. The basic Hunting License is not an all-inclusive document in Texas. There are a variety of other licenses, permits, decals, tags and stamps (Dove, Archery and Duck) that are required with the basic license if you want to hunt and stay legal. I've counted approximately thirty-five items of paper required for the complete Texas hunter. State Revenue Newsletter No. 140, May-June, 1979 contains a listing of most of the items needed if you are a full time hunter and fisherman.

The first Texas Hunting Stamp was issued in 1971—the White-Wing Dove Stamp. However, 1973 was the banner year for the state revenue collector. The first Archery Stamp was issued and some hunting licenses were issued with colored tags featuring pictures of deer and turkey. I've sent nine different types of licenses and permits to the Editor in hopes he can photograph the entire license with tags attached(Ed. note: He can—see below). The different colors used on different tags each year as well as within each year sure do make a pretty display. This year is also the first year that a combination Hunting and Fishing License was issued. Information on Fishing Licenses and other collaterial permits will be the basis for another story later on.

I don't want to use a thousand words; however, I will be happy to answer questions in event the picture copies are not clear or self-explanatory. For example, the licenses are issued in booklets of 25 to agent vendors. They are serially numbered in consecutive order. Each license comes in a three-part snapout with copies for the Hunter, Auditor and agent seller. Only the License copy has the tags which are rouletted for easy removal and attachment to any game killed. My personal file contains copies of these tags from 1975 to 1980. I would appreciate hearing from anyone with copies from 1973 and 1974. My address is PO Box 14744, Austin, Texas 78761.

The license books appearing below were prepared for bidders to print the next years' supply of licenses. Each has a front cover identifying the type of license, serial numbers and an accountability value on the front. An inner cover designed to place under each license as it is filled out and prevent the NCR paper from marking through on the unused licenses contains part of the instructions to the issuing agent. The back of the license packet has the remainder of the directions printed on it.

In the interest of saving space one of each size license packet is shown in total with the licenses only shown on the similar-sized items.
