THE COMPLETE PICTORIAL WATERFOWL HUNTING STAMPS. By C. R. Pendl, 1983, 114pp, 8½ x 11. Published by Camden House, Inc., Box 4836, Hampden Station, Baltimore, MD 21211. Available from the publisher at \$29.95 (hardbound) or \$34.95 (loose-leaf), plus \$2.50 postage and handling.

This is a book with a problem - it doesn't know if it's a book or an album. As an album, it has serious flaws. While it includes spaces for federal duck stamps and state pictorial issues including printers waste material such as imperfs from California and Iowa, the states are not arranged alphabetically. Rather, they are arranged in the order in which they issued pictorial duck stamps. Thus California is first, Iowa second, and so on. This would not be a problem if it were possible to rearrange the pages in alphabetical order. But this can not be done as pages are printed on both sides and often one state ends on one side of a page and another begins on the other side. This also, of course, makes it impossible to insert supplements or blank pages, even in the loose-leaf edition. Further, as any collector knows, mounting stamps on facing pages can cause damage to the stamps when the album is opened. As an album, then, the book receives very low marks.

As a monograph that tries to impart information on the stamps discussed, the book also leaves a great deal to be desired. There just isn't very much information in it. While most stamps are illustrated, in black and white, colors and perforation types are not listed. What will be of interest to the collector is the listing of the name of the artist of each stamp and the quantity of stamps sold. This information appears, along with the size of the stamp, under the space for the stamp. However, it is unclear whether the figure for number of stamps sold represents the number sold during the license year (and thus the number actually used by hunters) or the total number sold to hunters and collectors up to the time the data was gathered. The book ends with three appendices listing 1) the number of federal duck stamps sold in each state for each year these have been issued 2) the addresses of the conservation department of each state and 3) a priced listing of all the federal and state stamps listed in the book. The priced listing is already out of date but the data in the other two appendices may be of interest to collectors, especially the addresses.

ORLAHOMA CHANGES LICENSING SYSTEM

Nember I.G. Pfalser has provided information on Oklahoma's altered hunting and fishing licensing procedures. The state has adopted a 'license carrier' similar to the Michigan passbook device which enables the sportsman to have all their permits on one card for easy reference and as insurance to be sure that the proper permit is being carried if requested for inspection by proper authorities.

Officials in the Oklahoma Wildlife Department point to considerably reduced costs in printing and distributing licenses as well as convenience to the sportsman. The carrier even includes a Lost License Replacement Stub which can be detached from the carrier before use and the numbers of the various permits purchased listed on it and left in the home. Should the carrier be lost or destroyed the stub can be mailed to the state for replacement permits.

Holders of lifetime hunting or fishing, or combo permits will not be affected by most of the new system. But the carrier is to be used when a trout stamp, required yearly of every trout fisherman, is purchased. The carrier can also be utilized for Federal duck stamps each fall.

Two major hunting licenses are not included in the new procedure. Deer and turkey tags must still be purchased and carried separately--at least for the time being.

The individual permits are printed on different colored paper with a self-adhesive backing. When a permit is purchased the selling dealer fills in the date and name of the purchaser and affixes the stamp to the carrier.

"THE CANADIAN REVENUE STAMP CATALOGUE"

The second edition of this indispensible compilation by E.S.J. Van Dam has just appeared. First issued in 1982 this new edition has revised pricing, includes revenue meters and most significantly, contains a new 8 page section on Alberta Hunting stamps.

The catalog is particularly notable for its crisp photographs, tight organization and comprehensive listings. State and local revenue collectors thinking of expanding their interests north of the border will need this work as their jumping off point.

TAX RATES CHANGE

In the never-ended effort to finance governments in many states have imposed increased levies which should result in new material for State Revenue collectors. Any members finding examples illustrating the changes are urged to send the information to the Editor.

ARKANSAS. The Arkansas tobacco products tax on cigarettes is increased from 17.5¢ to 21¢ per pack of twenty cigaretts, effective March 10, 1983.

COLORADO. Effective November 1, 1983 through June 30, 1985, the Colorado cigarette tax rate is increased from 5 mills to 7 1/2 mills per cigarette(from 10¢ to 15¢ per pack of twenty cigarettes).

CONNECTICUT. Effective August 1, 1983 the Connecticut cigarette tax in increased from 21¢ to 26¢ per pack.

GEORGIA. A Georgia excise tax is imposed on little cigars weighing not more than three pounds per thousand at the rate of 2 mills each and on all other cigars at the rate of 15% of the wholesale cost price, exclusive of any trade, cash or other discounts or any promotion, advertising, display or similar allowances. Formerly, the tax on little cigars weighing not more than three pounds per thousand was 2 mills each, and the tax on all other cigars(imposed on the retail price) ranged from 1.5 mills for a cigar costing 3 1/3¢ or less to 20 mills for a cigar costing more than 20¢. The change is effective July 1, 1983.

IOWA. The Iowa cigarette tax rate is indefinitely continued at 18¢ per pack of twenty cigaretts. Formerly, the rate had been scheduled to drop to 13¢ per pack(15¢ per pack for cigarettes weighing more than three pounds per thousand) on July 1, 1983.

KANSAS. Effective July 1, 1983 the Kansas cigarette tax rate is increased from 11¢ to 16¢ per pack of twenty. If the increase in the federal excise tax onccigarettes imposed and in effect on Janaury 1, 1983 is abolished, the Kansas rate becomes 24¢ per pack of twenty cigarettes on October 1, 1985.

MAINE. Effective September 23, 1983 the Maine cigarette rate is increased from 16¢ to 20¢ per pack of twenty. (If a federal program providing financial assistance for medical expenses due to catastrophic illness is enacted, the tax rate is reduced by one mill per cigarette).

MASSACHUSETTS. Effective July 11, 1983 the Massachusetts cigarette tax rate is increased from 21¢ to 26¢ per pack of twenty cigarettes.

MONTANA. Effective July 1, 1983 the Montana cigarette tax is increased from 12¢ to 16¢ per pack of twenty.

NEBRASKA. The Nebraska cigarette tax rate is indefinitely continued at 184 per pack of twenty cigaretts. Formerly, the rate had been slated to drop to 154 on May 1, 1984.

NEVADA. Effective July 1, 1983 through June 30, 1985 the Nevada cigarette sale and use tax is increased from 10¢ to 15¢ per pack of twenty. Effective the same date a tax is imposed equal to 30% of the wholesale

price of tobacco products other than cigarettes. The new tax is to be collected and paid by the wholesale dealer. On July 1, 1985 the cigarette tax reverts to 10¢ per pack and the wholesale tax is repealed.

NEW HAMPSHIRE. The New Hampshire cigarette tax rate will be increased to the rate of the Vermont cigarette tax on the date the Vermont tax is raised, except that if Vermont's tax exceeds 17ϕ per pack. Effective August 15, 1983 the Vermont cigarette tax was increased from 12ϕ to 17ϕ per pack. Thus the New Hampshire cigarette tax is also increased to 17ϕ per pack effective August 15, 1983.

NEW YORK. The New York cigarette tax rate is raised from 15ϕ to 21¢ per pack of twenty from April 1, 1983 through March 31, 1985. On April 1, 1985 the rate is scheduled to revert to 15¢ per pack.

NORTH DAKOTA. Effective April 1, 1983 the North Dakota cigarette tax is increased from 12¢ to 18¢ per pack of twenty weighing not more than three pounds per thousand and from 6.5 mills to 9.5 mills per cigarette for those weighing more than three pounds per thousand.

OHIO. Effective March 2, 1984 the Ohio cigarette excise tax on the sale of cigaretts is imposed at the rate of 7 mills per cigarette rather than 7¢ per 10 cigaretts.

OREGON. Two additional Oregon cigarette taxes that expired June 30, 1983 are reimposed retroactively from July 1, 1983 until November 1, 1983 at which time a new additional tax is imposed running to Janaury 1, 1986. The basic Oregon cigarette tax is currently 9¢ per pack fo twenty. Two additional cigarette taxes totalling 10¢ per pack(for a combined total of 19¢) expired June 30, 1983. H.B. 2290 reimposes the two additional taxes on all cigarettes distributed until November 1, 1983 with payment of the tax due on or before November 20, 1983. A floor stock tax report and payment based on inventory held on November 1, 1983, are required from distributors on or before November 20. Another measure imposes an additional tax at the rate of 5 mills per cigarette(10¢ per pack of twenty) effective November 1, 1983 and in force to January 1, 1986. Thus, the total combined cigarette tax rate is 19¢ per pack.


VERMONT. The Vermont cigarette tax is raised from 12¢ to 17¢ per pack of twenty effective August 15, 1983.

WASHINGTON. The 15% cigarette surtax and the 7% surtax on tobacco products due to expire July 1, 1983 are continued indefinitely.

WISCONSIN. The tax rate, which was increased from 1982 from 20¢ to 25¢ per pack for the period May 1, 1982 to September 30, 1983 will remain in effect indefinitely. Also effective July 2, 1983 the Wisconsin tax on domestic tobacco products other than cigarettes is imposed at the rate of 20% of the manufacturer's list price to distributors without diminution by volume or other discounts. The tax is imposed on tobacco products imported from another country at the rate of 20% of the sume of the manufacturer's list price and federal tax, duties and transportation costs to the United States. The tax applies when the tobacco products are received by a Wisconsin distributor.

WEST VIRGINIA SOFT DRINK TAX

The Editor has seen in a local supermarket West Virginia Soft Drink Tax indicia on the top of generic pop bottles. The "Sugar Free Cola" is bottled in Twinsburg, Ohio by Great Lakes Canning, Inc. and obviously is being sold south of the Ohio River as well as to locations in Indiana.

The plastic top has a small(approx 7 mm. x 5mm.) outline of the state with a "4" in the middle of it. Neither are very clear in the several specimens examined and someone not familar with this tax would be mystified by the markings.




