IOWA DOCUMENTARIES



Illustrated in Figures 1 and 2 are two Iowa real estate transfer tax stamps. Both are of the cash register tape type used, according to the Iowa Department of Revenue and Finance, from the time the tax was instituted in 1968 until 1983. The stamp in Figure 1 is printed in red violet on light green safety paper. The safety design consists of large (about 24mm) Department of Revenue seals in the center of the paper. The small number to the left of the denomination is apparently a serial number indicating that this is the 17th stamp issued that day. The small number "4" just below the "FE" of "TRANSFER" designates the county in which the stamp was issued. A list of these county numbers follows this article. To the right of the denomination there is a large letter "B". The significance of this letter is unknown.

The stamp shown in Figure 2 is also printed in red violet ink but is on blue green safety paper. The safety design consists of small (about 12mm) Department of Revenue seals at each side of the paper. On this stamp, the county number is obscured by the "CANCELLED" handstamp. Both the stamps in Figures 1 and 2 are "coils" and are separated by a saw tooth type of separation. Both are obviously produced on gummed paper by a cash register, much like the receipt one receives from the local supermarket.

According to the Iowa Department of Revenue and Finance, in 1983 counties were given the option of using a cash register type of stamp or a handstamp. However, at least one county seems to have used a handstamp in the collection of the real estate tax as early as 1975. Shown in Figure 3 (next page) is an example of a handstamp

used in Scott County on April 21, 1975. The basic handstamp is in red violet. Below another handstamp appears, in black, noting the separate recording and transfer fees paid.

Can any reader provide more information on the Iowa documentaries? I encourage all past and present Iowa residents to dig out their old deeds and see if they have any documentary stamps affixed. I welcome all correspondence regarding these stamps. My address is 5201 Bluff Rd., Lincoln, NE 68514.



THE STORY OF THE DISCOVERY OF THE TROUT AND GAME STAMP

When that indefatigable collector of revenue stamps Morton D. Joyce was stationed in England in the winter of 1944, he received a Christmas gift box from home. On opening it, he noticed a hitherto unchronicled tax stamp on a tin of Processed Fish Pate. A 25 x 33mm. 5¢ stamp, printed in black on blue paper, perf. 12, and reading: STATE OF NEW YORK / CONSERVATION DEPARTMENT / ALBANY, N.Y. / (state arms) / PROCESSED / TROUT AND GAME STAMP / PAID 5 CENTS.

Immediately setting in motion the wheels of inquiry through me back home, I unearthed the following facts. The stamps were a rather short-lived issue and of no denomination other than 5¢. They were printed in gummed sheets of 100 (10 x 10) imperf. around the edges, and no marginal imprints; each stamp is overprinted with a different consecutive serial number in red figures 4mm. high. The stamps were in use in New York only from April 13, 1941, to March 2, 1944, by requirement under Chapter 318 of the Laws of 1941. These stamps were apparently an excise tax, with the added intention of restricting the wholesale processing and sale of certain species of trout and game birds, especially when taken in New York State. They were also required on all containers of the same products sent in for sale from other states. One stamp was required to be affixed to each can or container of such processed products by the processor before it could be legally sold in New York. The stamps are cousins to the famous South Carolina oyster and clam tax stamps, and to the rare

Virginia scallops stamps.

The Conservation Department ran into difficulties of enforcement, both legal and technical. Some buyers began to regard the stamp as a sort of guarantee of the contents of the container, but microscopic examination and chemical analysis showed that one firm was sending in from the state of Washington, some processed salmon labelled as trout, and there was another argument over some imported Iceland "trout."

There was also the expense of the numerous and necessary inspectors. The attempt to control matters by means of a stamp was therefore abandoned as impractical. Consequently, as the stamps were no longer required, their use was discontinued after passage of an Amendment under Chapter 88 of the Laws of 1944. This Amendment also provided for refunding at face, for a few months, any unused stamps which might be turned in by previous purchasers.

In January and February of 1945, I was able to find on large New York City grocery store shelves only one stamp on a tin of trout pate and two on tins of processed pheasant. By making a trip to Albany I learned that all the remainders and also all the stamps which had been turned in for refund had been burned. However, I was given a list of firms who had purchased stamps, and after much running around in lower Manhatten and Brooklyn and after considerable correspondence with out-of-state firms, a few unused stamps were gradually found. They remain a scarce item, but of much interest.

EDITOR'S FURTHER NOTE: Fish and game stamp expert E. L. Vanderford tells me that these stamps are not all that rare, so perhaps a holding of remainders came to light after this article appeared. Can anyone supply any further details?
