

Texas joined the lengthening list of states using stamp taxes to control sales of illegal drugs effective September 1, 1989. The tax rate is \$200 per gram for controlled substances and \$3.50 per gram for marijuana. Interestingly, the law imposes these taxes on counterfeit and simulated controlled substances and marijuana as well. As far as I know, other states drug stamp tax laws do not included this provision.

The Texas stamps are by far the most professionally designed of all the state drug tax stamps issued to date. The designs are indeed striking. A copy of the marijuana tax stamp is shown above, en1y actual size. The stamp is printed in black on a silver foil background. The design of the controlled substances stamps features a skull and crossbones. There are four denoninations in the marijuana series: \$3.50, \$101.50, \$1589.00, and \$3,500.00. There are five denominations in the controlled substance series: \$200, \$1,400, \$3,000, \$5,800, and \$100,000. The \$100,000 stamp is, to the best of my knowledge, the highest face value revenue stamp ever issued by either any state or the federal government. EDITORIAL

HIGH PRESSURE MASS MARKETING COMES TO STATE REVENUES

Fleetwood, a division of UNICOVER Corp. of Cheyenne, Wyoming, and the National Wildlife Federation of Washington, DC have brought slick marketing to the collection of state waterfowl stamps. Late in 1988 beautifully printed brochures appeared in major philatelic weeklies and in the mail boxes around the nation offering "complete" collections of 1988 state duck stamps. These brochures contained the usual number of misleading statements and half-truths that one has come to expect of mass marketed philatelic material. Some statements were out and out false. For example, it was stated that the first state duck stamp was issued by California in 1971. Of course, as is well known to collectors of state hunting and fishing stamps, South Dakota issued the first state duck stamps in 1949. A second, and more serious, misleading statement made in the offering was that the collection was a "complete" collection of 1988 state duck stamps. In fact, it consisted of only one stamp from each of the 42 states issuing duck stamps in 1988. Not included were the distinctly different stamps issued by several states for residents and non-residents. Also not included were the different stamps issued by some states for use by hunters and for sale to collectors.

A complaint regarding the false statements was sent to UNICOVER, the National Wildlife Federation, the Federal Trade Commission and the Office of the Postal Inspector. The response received from UNICOVER reveals much regarding this firms "ethics" and their view of the people to whom they sell they products. Regarding the statement that California issued the first duck stamp, Patrick W. Beckett, Product Manager at UNICOVER stated, in a letter dated January 30, 1989 to Don O'Brien, National Wildlife Federation Director, that the South Dakota stamps weren't really stamps, just "text only stickers." In other words, if it doesn't have a pretty picture, it's not a stamp! If Mr. Beckett's knowledge of ducks is as limited as his knowledge of stamps obviously is, he must consider a black duck just a "brownonly bird" since it lacks pretty colored feathers!

In response to the charge that the collection was complete, Beckett argued that "In developing our definition of completeness we considered who our Duck Stamp Collectors are. They are generally amateur, unsophisticated collectors and sportsmen who would feel they would be 'taken advantage of' or 'loaded up' if we sold them two, three, or four stamps of the <u>same artwork design</u> from <u>the same</u> <u>state</u> that could be distinguished as different only by an expert or by measuring the perforations." One wonders how much of an "expert" one would need to be to note the differences between two stamps with different face values, one inscribed "RESIDENT," the other inscribed "NON-RESIDENT." In any event, the clear meaning of Mr. Beckett's remarks is that it's ok to tell less than the full truth to "amateurs" and the "unsophisticated."

Not a lot has changed in the UNICOVER/National Wildlife Federation offering for their "complete" collection of 1989 state duck stamps. A brochure for this collection has recently made its appearance. Apparently in response to the complaint about the incorrect description of the 1971 California duck stamp, it is now described as the first "State Waterfowl-art Stamp." (It should be noted that these guys aren't real strong on correct use of capital letters!)

The emphasis on the completeness of the 1989 collection has been slightly reduced from what it was in 1988, but one still reads that "The America's 1989 State Duck Stamp Collection brings togather a complete collection of 1989 Duck Stamps - including one Duck Stamp from each of the 44 issuing states."

The real kicker in the 1989 set, in common with so much philatelic (and numismatic) merchandise sold to the "unsophisticated" via mass marketing techniques is the astonishingly high price charged for common and easily obtainable items. The cost of each stamp in the 1989 set is \$9.75. This does not include an unstated "modest" charge for shipping, handling and insurance. With 44 issues, at at least \$9.75 each, the minimum total cost for the set is \$429.

This high price is one of the most offensive aspects of this, and other, mass market philatelic promotions. When, sooner or later, purchasers try to sell the "complete" collection they paid so much for, they will be offered only a small fraction of their original purchase price by dealers or other collectors. The natural response will be to conclude that the entire stamp collecting hobby is a rip-off, rather than to focus on the con men from whom the material was purchased in the first place. So both the individual buyers and philately in general suffer from this type of mass marketing.

The National Wildlife Federation, a partner in this promotion, is a respected conservation organization. They are, presumably, unaware, of the real nature of the operation in which they have become involved. Readers who might wish to inform the NWF about what its involved with can write to Mr. Jay D. LOUISIANA GOVERNOR'S EDITION STAMPS SELLING FOR 20 TIMES FACE

Louisiana issued a resident and a non-resident Governor's Edition duck stamp in 1989. The stamps carry no surcharge over their nominal face value of \$5 and \$7.50. But, collectors could not buy them from the state. They were available only in full sheet lots at auction. As such, only dealers bid in the auction. As of this writing (Jan. 1990) a set of the resident and non-resident type is selling for \$250. Once again, collectors are ripped off by the issuance of Governors Edition stamps, the dealers profit and the ducks get little.


ALABAMA LOCAL REVENUE STAMPS: CURRENT ISSUES

The towns and cities of Alabama continue to issue local revenue stamps at a great rate. Most are used to evidence payment of local taxes on tobacco products. This listing is of previously unreported stamps currently in use. It is almost certainly not complete! The listed stamps are available in sets of singles or panes of ten, along with previously reported stamps, from the SRS. A full listing of the available stamps and an order form follows this article. Previous listings of Alabama local stamps can be found in Bellinghausen and Pruess (1973), Hines (1983) and Hines (1984). Essays and proofs of some of these stamps were described by Hines (1988b) and the printing format for the decals was illustrated in Hines (1988a).

In the following listing the stamps are water transfer decals unless otherwise stated. All illustrations appear at the end of the listing. The abbreviation "TL" in the description of a stamp indicates that it is of the familiar tobacco leaf design, examples of which appears below. "TRT" indicates the presence of a safety design reading "TOBACCO REVENUE TAX" while "RTS" indicates a reversed safety design reading "PMATS XAT EVNEVER."

IDAHO DRUG TAX STAMPS. Shown at left, actual size, is an example of the Idaho marijuana stamp. The inscriptions are black on a green background. The state seal is in white. The denomination of the stamp (\$3.50 in this case) as well as the indentification of the person who issued and approved the issuance of the stamps is filled in by hand on each stamp. These appear to have been printed in coil type format as they are imperforate at the sides but rouletted at the top and bottom. In addition to the marijuana stamps, there are two different stamps inscribed "CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE," one in red, the other in blue.
