



Idaho Liquor Stamps Found Dissolve In Water

Shown above are the remains of a block of six Idaho State Liquor Dispensary stamps that were given to me by a friend. I do not know their use. I examined them closely, saw no cut cancels and attempted to soak them off. That was a big mistake. The stamps were on a thin plastic feeling paper and proceeded to come apart into a million pieces. It appeared to me that the paper had something in it that dissolved, however, I may just have missed a cut cancel.

The disappearance was very sad because they were the most finely detailed state stamps I had ever seen. The main design is a dark blue with a black control number added. The design features a highly detailed map of Idaho, the state seal and fine lathework in the background. A small inscription at the bottom indicates that the stamps were made by the American Bank Note Company. The design measures 17 by 24 and appears imperforate.

Anyone encountering these stamps should be forewarned. Do not soak them.

SRS Plans Annual Publication, Catalogs Call For Manuscripts Announced

The State Revenue Society is popular because it offers collectors of state revenue material one of the few sources of information about this specialized collecting area. A lack of available information about this specialty is what caused the Society to be founded and is one of the reason that the organization continues to exist.

State revenue stamps offer some of the most challenging research opportunities of any phase of philately. The variety of subject areas seems endless.

However, other than the bimonthly *State Revenue Newsletter* and the *ICAR* newsletter, the specialty appears to be in a lull with regard to the publication of state revenue research.

In his September President's Message, SRS President Terence Hines makes a call for renewed publication of State Revenue related handbooks and catalogs.

There is a definite need for these reference works because, with the passage of time, it becomes harder and harder to reconstruct state tax stamp issuances and their related history.

The handbooks help to increase interest in the collecting of state revenue material and thereby increase the depth of study when the resultant newcomers originate their own research.

Collectors who wish to share their research and knowledge are encouraged to submit their material for publication in one of three ways.

Short articles of less than four typed,

double spaced pages should be submitted for the State Revenue Newsletter.

Articles longer than four double-spaced pages should be submitted for the new State Revenue Annual that is scheduled to make its appearance in 1992.

Specialized studies by state, city or topic should be submitted for publication as handbooks or catalogs.

Send along photocopies of material that accompanies the manuscript. Don't send valuable original stamps or other material unless you are asked to do so. Examples of the material being researched is very beneficial to collectors and adds tremendously to the value of the article or handbook.

Collectors planning to make a submission should contact the SRN editor at POB 505, Springfield, Va. 22150. Contact the editor early in your research so that he can offer suggestions to enhance your presentations. All submissions will be considered for publication.

State Revenue Society Board members are also available for consultation about needed areas of study.

President's Message By Terence Hines

On behalf of all the officers and Board members elected in the recent election, I would like to thank the members for their support. I'm looking forward to an active couple of years for the State Revenue Society with more and better services for members.

There are several projects that I would like to see instituted in the next year or so.

First and foremost, I would like to see a state revenue mail bid sale established which would run regularly in the newsletter. There is almost no state revenue material in the American Revenue Association's regular auctions and, even if there were, I suspect that many SRS members would not benefit as they are not ARA members.

A mail bid sale is a lot of work and we would need someone to volunteer to be the sale manager. The individual who ends up running the sales would, ideally, have a considerable amount of knowledge of state revenues along with some sales experience and, if possible, access to a computer with which to handle the paperwork the sale would generate. There is at least one program written specifically for philatelic mail sales which the SRS would provide. Any volunteers should contact me as soon as possible.

The SRS has not published any state catalogs since the 1984 New England states catalog. I want to get the SRS back into the catalog publishing business! We certainly have the funds to support such publications. I am currently working on an update to the New England catalog, but full state catalogs are needed.

Members with manuscripts that are

ready for publication, almost ready for publication, kind of ready, not quite ready, or just in the planning stages should contact Editor Peter Martin and myself so that we can start planning. Publications are certainly not limited to state catalogs - manuscripts on any aspect of state revenue collecting are welcome.

Starting with the next issue of the newsletter, the Secretary (me) will report new members plus their collecting interests. We plan to publish a membership directory (the last one was in 1984 and it didn't list members' collecting interests) within the year that will list members' collecting interests and, if they permit, members' addresses. Those who object to having their addresses listed because of fear of thefts, etc. will be able to eliminate their addresses.

Such a directory, ideally combined with a full index of the newsletter, will be of great help to members as it will permit them to correspond with members with similar interests. You will be receiving within the next year a questionnaire that will be used to compile the directory.

In the past several years the SRS has exposed a number of scams and rip-offs related to state revenues. I have always felt that such exposures were an important part of the service the Society provided to members. I pledge to, continue such exposures, when necessary, in the future.

The next year or so promises to be an exciting one for the SRS and its members. With your help we'll make the Society even better than it is now.



Library Notes By Terence Hines Three Books Added Two books about duck stamps and one about Danish West Indies revenues have just

been added to the SRS Library. Duck Stamps and Prints: The Complete Federal and State Editions by J. McCaddin, New York: Park Lane, 1988. The is a "coffee table" book with full color illustrations of many federal and state duck stamps and prints. It contains a small amount of useful information on each state duck stamp such as the number printed and sold. The book is large, 11 1/4 x 14 1/4.

Duck Stamps: Art in the Service of Conservation by S. Weidensaul, New York: Gallery Books, 1989. This is another, smaller (10 1/4 x 12 3/4) coffee table book with lots of pretty pictures and some useful text. There are four chapters titled "The Federal Duck Stamps," "The State Programs," "The Artists," and "The Business of Duck Stamps." The text is largely superficial in the style of a puff piece with no mention of the serious problems facing state and federal duck stamp programs. These problems center around the vast sums going to the artists and purveyors of duck stamp gimmicks (medalions, prints, artists proofs, etc.) that would go to the ducks if the state and federal governments would tighten their control over the money involved.

NOTE: Both of these books were very expensive when first published. The McCaddin volume retailed for \$60. The SRS Library obtained this title for \$11.95 and the Weidensaul title for \$4.95 from a dealer in remaindered books, Edward R. Hamilton, Falls Village, CT 06031-5000 (the complete address) plus a \$3 per order shipping charge. To obtain inexpensive copies of these titles order them from Hamilton.

D.W.I. Revenue Stamped Paper and Adhesives by Timothy McRee is a 16-page booklet donated to the SRS library by the author. The booklet, covering issues from the earliest stamped paper dating from 1774 through the early 20th century, is heavily illustrated with documents and stamps.

South Carolina Sells Four Business License Stamps

A m o n g the stamps that South Carolina currently sells, are four B u s i n e s s L i c e n c e



stamps—with values of one, seven, nine and 11 cents.

The one-cent stamp was originally used to tax malt, which was taxed from 1930-1988. Currently, it is used (and rarely, at that) to tax Sampoerna 234's, an imported clove cigarette. The seven-cent (20 cigarettes, tax paid), nine-cent (25 cigarettes, tax paid), and 11 cent (30 cigarettes, tax paid) stamps are the current water-decals that are used.

South Carolina began taxing cigarettes

in 1923. Until 1952, hand-applied stamps were used. Starting in 1952, adco, or heatapplied type stamps were introduced and continue to this day.

Until about 1985, only "20 tax paid" stamps were used. At that time, the 25 pack was introduced. In 1987, the 30 pack was introduced, but it will be phased out by October.

Copies of the four stamps can be purchased as a set of singles (28 cents) or in panes of 10 (\$2.80).

South Carolina detroys any obsolete stamps as soon as possible, but will sell any item that remains in their inventory.

New York Inherits 1987 Artist Signed Duck Stamps

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation has "inhereted" 9,100 copies of the artist signed 1987 New York duck stamp featuring wood ducks.

How did the Department acquire such a large holding of these stamps four years after they were issued? According to the Department, an unnamed large dealer in this type of material was unable to pay a debt to the Department and the stamps were accepted instead. The unnamed dealer has apparently gone bankrupt.

The stamps are being offered at \$65 per stamp by the Department at 50 Wolf Rd., Rm. 532, Albany, NY 12233-4750. (Terence Hines)



Clifton Forge, Va. Introduces New Cigarette Stamps

The city of Clifton Forge, Va., introduced three new cigarette stamps, effective July 1, 1990: 4 cents (20 pack cigarettes), 5 cents (25 pack cigarettes) and 6 cents (30 pack cigarettes). The stamps are available as a set of singles (15 cents) or in panes of 10 (\$1.50).

Washington State Issues Conveyance Tax Stamps

The Washington Department of Revenue, Olympia, has provided photocopies of their conveyance tax stamps. The \$500 and \$100 stamps were printed in pad or book form. Shown is the



\$20 stamp, which is the same design as all other stamps below the \$100 value. The only difference is the printed amount and color. All stamps below the \$100 value were printed in sheets of 100.

According to D.L. Cooper, chief of the state's UCP/Estate Tax Section, Miscellaneous Tax Division, there are no

plans at the present time to sell the stamps to collectors. The more likely disposition would be destruction of the supply currently held.

For Sale To First Acceptable Offer California Counties Documentary Stamps

These stamps were used in the 1960s for a period of only six months- the shortest period of use for any stamps issued by the United States or any state. Most counties used very few and the remainders were destroyed. Possibly the RAREST OF ALL FEDERAL AND STATE STAMPS to date.

Many of these stamps had only a 100 copies issued and most were used on deeds or destroyed when discontinued. Few can be salvaged from deeds because they are in the hands of uninterested property owners who will likely destroy them when the property is sold. Of the many odd and high values, the only stamps likely to survive are the mint copies obtained in swaps or bought from the few counties that would sell them to stamp collectors.
