Spurred To Action

I just finished reading the current issue of the *State Revenue Newsletter* and once again you've done a good job. I've been planning to write you for some time. The Nebraska drug tax stamp article finally spurred me to action.

I joined the Lincoln Stamp Club last March and have since become friends with fellow SRS member Ken Pruess. He presented a program to our club on state drug tax stamps including the new ones from Nebraska. I had heard of them on the local TV news only, since I don't have a subscription to the local newspaper. Ken provided me photocopies of two newspaper articles on the Nebraska drug stamps. They provide a lot more information on the program such as that the \$10 denomination was added later. As Ken explained, he was the Department of Revenue's "guinea pig" since he was the first stamp collector who wanted to buy these stamps. The Department of Revenue hadn't realized that collectors would want to buy them. In response, they added the \$10 denomination.

In the previous issue you asked for members collecting interests. I like all state revenues but this field is so huge that I wanted to specialize. Everyone collects fish and game stamps and their issue is getting to be quite commercialized, so I didn't choose this area. I don't smoke, drink, or use drugs, so these areas didn't appeal very much. Out of what remains, I have chosen to specialize in revenues for food products. This area is larger than I had first thought and includes stamps for apples, citrus fruit, potatoes, tomatoes, eggs, oleomargarine, powdered milk, seafood, honey, etc.

My scope also includes issues from the federal government, private organizations, and foreign countries. From the research I've done so far it's likely that the bulk of my collection will be state revenues. My goal is to do more research, eventually write articles about my progress, and someday write my own catalog.

In the process of doing research for my specialty collection, I went through the entire run of the *SRN*. I must inform you that the existing indexes contain numerous errors. Unfortunately, I didn't take notes on what

they were. An updated and corrected index is definitely a project that should be conquered. Michael Florer Lincoln, Neb.

SRS Semi-Annual Auction Proposed Members To Determine Merit Of New Offering

Since there are so few places to buy and sell state revenue stamps, a number of members have suggested that the SRS sponsor periodic auctions.

It takes a tremendous amount of time and effort to operate a society auction, but if there is sufficient interest an SRS auction will begin in the Fall.

The operation will be kept simple, similar to the American Revenue Association auction.

Rules being considered are: only state revenue and cinderella material to be offered; minimum bid of \$1; the seller must separately package each lot with a lot description and minimum bid and estimated price; the SRS takes a ten percent seller commission and buyers pay all postal charges.

Before a formal announcement is made, interest for an auction must be gaged.

Old Colorado Lottery Tickets Discarded

An article by Ray Flack in the Colorado Springs (Colorado) *Gazette Telegraph News* on Dec. 31, 1991 disclosed that the estimated 12 million unsold scratch lottery tickets remaining in the state each year are disposed of under contract by Data Destruction of Colorado.

After all unsold tickets are declared invalid, a lottery employee collects the unsold tickets from retail outlets and then a hole is drilled through the tickets, usually in stacks

NJ Tax Stamp Meters Eliminated July 1

Effective July 1, cigarette tax stamp metering machines will no longer be authorized in New Jersey. The Director of the Divsion of Taxation has revoked the authorization to use stamp metering machines as evidence of New Jersey cigarette

1991 Washington Waterfowl Stamp Available

The 1991 Waterfowl Stamp is available from the Washington Department of Wildlife, Attention: Tracy Clark, 600 Capitol Way N., Olympia, Wash. 98501-1091.

Indiana Has Intangible Tax Stamps

Shown here are examples of Intangible Tax stamps and the Indiana Form 42-1941 they were used on. Not being from Indiana I do not know under what circumstances this form was used.

The intangibles tax was a yearly tax based on the value of stocks, bonds or postal savings certificates in a persons possession. The tax appears to be 5-cents for each \$15 of value. The form is designed to be used for multiple years and most of those in my possession, from the years 1961 through 1964, have been.

The form has a place for a name and address, however each of my copies has what may be a tax number at the top. The 25 $1/2 \times 16$ mm designs are rouletted 6.

The values and colors I have turned up are listed below. Almost certainly, the 5cent, 10-cent, 25-cent, 50-cent, \$1 and \$5 values exist for all these years


