Inaugural Service Award Winners Named Society Founder, Five Others Honored At SRS Annual Meeting

The State Revenue Society inaugurated its Distinguished Service Award October 1 by naming six current and deceased members for the prestigious honor.

The awards were announced at the SRS annual meeting held during the 1994 Philadelphia National Stamp Exhibition in King of Prussia, Pa.

Included in the first class of inductees were E.S.A. (Bert) Hubbard, Kenneth Pruess, Frank Applegate, George Cabot, Charles Hermann and E.L. Vanderford.

Hubbard, who now lives in San Jose, Calif., founded the State Revenue Society in 1955, served as its first president for 14 years, edited the State Revenue Newsletter for the first year and publishes what is still the only comprehensive catalog of state revenue stamps.

Hubbard was in attendance at the annual meeting and was presented a plaque in the

shape of the United States by SRS President Peter Martin. The presentation ceremony was repeated at the ARA annual meeting.

Pruess, an SRS Honorary Life Member living in Lincoln, Neb., is another SRS pioneer. He edited the State Revenue Newsletter for 43 issues from September 1966 to July 1973 and provided assistance to numerous collectors. He also edited the Nebraska State Revenue Catalog in 1972.

Vanderford died in 1994 before the awards were announced. He was a pioneer cataloger of state fish and game stamps and discovered many early rarities. He was known for his unselfish help of other collectors.

Applegate, Cabot and Hermann were early writers and catalogers of state revenues.

Cabot edited the Cabot State and City Revenue and Tax Stamp Catalog in 1940 and it remained the standard until Hubbard published a revised version in 1960.

Hermann was known for his state revenue columns and served as SRS treasurer.

The Distinguished Service award was created as the Society's highest award to recognize outstanding long-term service to the SRS and state revenue collecting.

The selections were made by the SRS Board of Governors based on nominations from the membership.

Except for the first year, no more than three nominees may be inducted in any one year.

The names of recipients will be entered onto a permanent plaque.

Members who would like to make nominations for 1995 inductees should forward the names and a brief (up to one page) description of the nominee's accomplishments to SRS President Peter Martin by June 30, 1995.

Bilek, Pacific Press Produce 100th *SRN*

State Revenue Newsletter number 219 has a special significance; it marks the 100th issue printed by Dick Bilek and his Franklin Park, Ill.,-based Pacific Press.

Bilek printed his first SRN issue in January 1976 with Volume 16, Number 1, whole number 120, and his involvement has continued unabated ever since.

Bilek's efforts made an immediate improvement in the society journal with a new banner and much improved graphics.

Issue 219 was also the first produced by David Drury, the Fort Wayne, Ind., editor who produced the newsletter until March

1985 with whole number 169. Terry Hines edited the newsletter until December 1990 (whole number 197), when the current editor assumed the editorial reigns.

Bilek, a state revenue collector, offered his services to the Society at cost and it is safe to say that without his support SRS dues would have increased many times in the intervening years.

For his tremendous impact upon the Society, the State Revenue Society Board of Governors voted to make Bilek an SRS Honorary Life Member. The announcement was made October 1 at the SRS annual meeting at the 1994 Philadelphia National

Stamp Exhibition in King of Prussia, Pa.

To commemorate the special achievement, Bilek received an SRS presentation plaque.

Annual Meeting Report

The joint SRS/ARA annual convention held at the 1994 Philadelphia National Stamp Exhibition September 30 to October 2 was another success.

In 1993 the SRS held its first annual convention in many years at CHICAGOPEX '93. The joint gathering proved a popular way for state and federal revenue collectors to talk about their specialties and was continued in 1994 at the show is held in King of Prussia, Pa., outside of Philadelphia.

The show hotel, located next to the convention center was the newly renovated Sheraton Valley Forge Hotel.

Unfortunately for attendees, the hotel changed ownership due to bankruptcy proceedings during the middle of the show and hotels services, particularly the food service were very substandard. It got so bad that the show committee was attempting to get refunds for banquet attendees.

The SRS/ARA annual dinner meeting was also affected. Held at the highly rated Bocconcini Restaurant in the hotel, many participants complained about the food and service. Despite the problems, members in attendance had a rousing time talking about their revenue specialty and the philatelic hobby.

The show bourse was much better with wide aisles, good lighting and dealers who brought a variety of revenue material, including state revenues.

The SRS held its annual meeting October 1 with 10 members from six states in attendance.

A state of the society report was presented and the new SRS logo was unveiled. Also announced were the new SRS exhibition award to be instated in 1995 and a new \$50 award for the best research article published in the *State Revenue Newsletter* each year.

Volume 32, Number 4 (whole number 219) is the eight-page newsletter. Volume 32, Number 5 (whole number 220) is the SRS Catalog of Turkey Stamps distributed at the same time. The first six recipients of the newly created SRS Distinguished Service Award were also announced (see related article on page 1). SRS founder Bert Hubbard was in attendance and received his plaque, a ceremony that was repeated in front of the ARA general meeting.

Past-president Terry Hines, back from Poland, was made an Honorary Life Member and received a plaque for his 18 years of service as Society president.

Although unable to attend, SRS printer Dick Bilek was made an Honorary Life member and recognized for printing 100 issues of the *State Revenue Newsletter* (see related story page 1).

Also recognized were Vice President/ Treasurer Harold Effner Jr. for his continued service to the Society and new secretary Scott Troutman.

The 1995 SRS/ARA annual convention will be held at TEXPEX '95, June 9-11. The venue will be the Dallas Medallion Hotel located by the L.B.J. Freeway (I635) and Midway Road. Plan now to attend!

Massachusetts Deed Tax Stamp "Error" Revisited

In the January-February, 1989 *SRN*(Vol. 27, Number 1) Ireported a \$10 Massachusetts deed tax stamp without a serial number in the panel. All other values of the series (Hines numbers D1-10), including previously seen copies of the \$10(D6) stamp, had serial numbers.

A recent acquisition suggests that the lack of serial numbers on the reported stamp may not have been an error.

Texas Has New Trash

State and local governmentsare dealing with the issue of solid waste in many ways. Mandatory recycling and composting are two of the more well known actions.

Brazos County, Texas, has come up with a new twist. The county requires residents to purchase solid waste validation stickers for 50 cents each and to use one per bag of trash.

The stickers are self adhesive and come in books of ten.

Colors are black on yellow with a serial number and a facsimile signature of the county judge.


Are these collectible? Is unused the best way to collect these stamps? What are other counties in Texas doing? Is there anything comparable happening in your neighborhood?

The SRS Sales Service has obtained one Brazos County book of solid waste Validation stickers.

You can purchase one, guaranteed unused, for 50 cents plus postage.

Illustrated is an upper right corner block of four of the \$10 value, without serial numbers. However, there is some type of sheet number in the selvedge. This number is printed in blue in approximately the same shade as that used to print the serial numbers.

Also shown is a upper right corner block of four the \$50 value (D7). This block does not have any number in the selvage, but each of the four stamps has an individual serial number. It would be nice to have examples of upper right corner blocks of other series denominations to know for sure, but it now seems likely to me that the "missing" serial numbers on the stamps without them aren't really missing. Rather, the serial number was simply replaced with a sheet number and this latter number used for control and accounting for sheets of stamps. This seems to me to be a more likely explanation than that the serial numbers were left off in error.
