DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA alcoholic beverage tax stamps have been eliminated and replaced by a monthly reporting and payment plan. This was approved in September and becomes effective December 1, 1961.

OUR APOLOGIES for the lateness of this issue of the NEWSLETTER. Late in the first place, it has been made still later due to the fact that the editor has been somewhat under the weather.

We do hope to have the November number ready and out in a week or so and thereby catch up somewhat.

DELAWARE CIGARETTE TAX is being increased from 3¢ to 5¢ per pack effective November 1st.

ALABAMA DOCUMENTARY TAX STAMPS will not be used on mineral documents after November 7th according to one of the tax bulletins we see. We are wondering if this is a stamp tax that has escaped us, or if they meant "Mississippi" instead of "Alabama." Can any one enlighten us? According to the information given the tax is still in effect, but the probate judge of the county where the property interest is located will note on the face of the instrument the amount of tax paid and stamps will not be used.

MARYLAND WINE STAMPS have been discontinued but the state still has some for sale according to a letter from the state officials shown us by Mr. R. H. Zimmerli. Attached to the letter is an order form for liquor, wine, and beer stamps for stamp collectors use. An order must be for a minimum of \$1.00, and a limit of eight stamps of any one denomination is placed on these philatelic orders.

This is a form of cooperation which we wish more states would take in the sale of their revenue stamps to collectors, and deserves some commendation.

The letter says that the Recordation Tax stamps are handled by the clerks of the courts of the various counties and Baltimore City and no doubt can be obtained from them at face value. (continued on page 18)





Bedding stamps may be obtained from Bedding and Upholstery Control Division. This division is part of the State Department of Health and is located in the State Office Building, Baltimore. Mr. H. F. Sullivan is in charge of this department.

The stamps for alcoholic beverage excise taxes may be had in limited quantities as stated in the first paragraph of this section. The order blank is headed:
