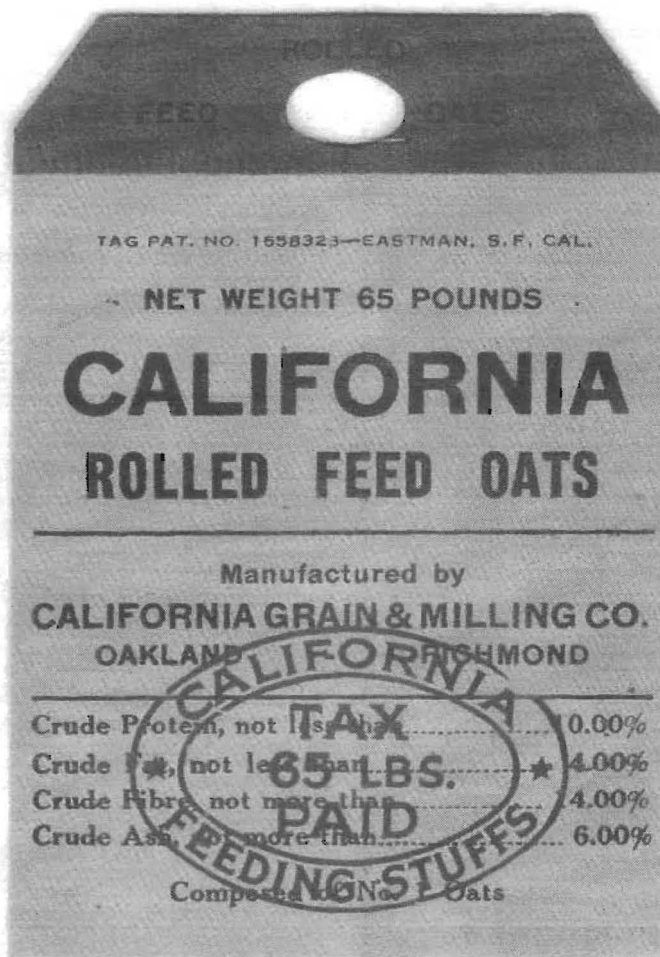

Harold Effner will speak about "Collecting Cigarette Stamps" and I will present "The Minnesota Christmas Tree Tax." A question and answer period will follow the presentations.

The SRS Board will meet prior to the annual meeting. Plan now to attend and meet your society officers.

SRS Catalog Sold Out; Reprinted

The *SRS State Revenue Stamps Catalog* sold out of the initial printing of 400 copies in less than 90 days making it an instant philatelic best seller and the top selling revenue publication since the 1985 10th edition of *Springer's Handbook of North American Cinderella Stamps Including Taxpaid Revenues*.

Because of the wave of interest and continuing orders, the SRS Board approved a second printing of 200 catalogs. At press time, nearly half of those had been sold. Because of planned updates, the board limited the number of spiral bound copies and determined that these will only be advertised in the *SRN*.

SRS Catalog Update #1

SRS Catalog Update #1 is completed and is enclosed with the Second Quarter *State Revenue News*. The Update, which consists of replacements for pages with incorrect illustrations and new pages for some accidental omissions, also will be mailed free of charge to any nonmember who purchased a catalog directly from the SRS; to dealers who purchased copies for their clients and to purchasers of the second printing.

Collectors have found that one of the benefits of having an up-to-date state revenue catalog is that they now have a basis to check their collections for new finds, which are still abundant in the state revenue field. Membership

The *SRS Catalog* has also spurred interest in SRS membership and we are setting new records. The membership report in this issue reflects 279 members at this writing, which is an all-time high. In early April, we also issued membership #1400 to Ken Simon from Lake Worth, Fla.

Indiana Feed and Fertilizer Stamps

by M.E. Matesen

I have discovered there are more varieties of these stamps than have been listed in either the old Hubbard or the new SRS Troutman catalog. The numbers at the top of the stamps seem to have to do with products being analyzed and I give them here as a reference tool. We may in time find this is a better way to list these.

There are considerable differences in the "length" of these issues running from 82mm down to 49mm. The width remains rather constant - within a mm or so at 49 to 50mm.

The following is a more detailed description of these stamps. Note that these stamps were copied while in a stock sheet so some may seem to have a line going across them..

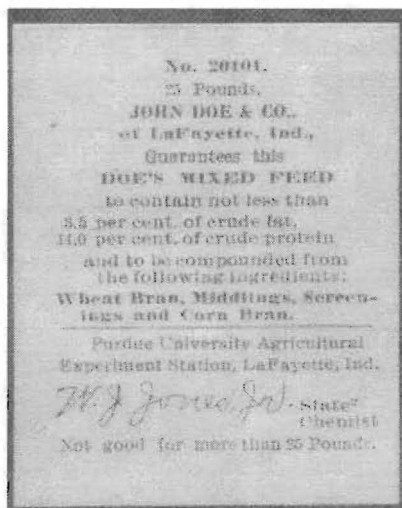


Figure 1. "No. 20101." at top. Exists in the weights of 25, 50 and 100 lbs. Signature in these first two are very light as compared with figures 3,4 and 5. "Purdue..." over signature. This is the one shown in the catalogs. Troutman FE1-FE3.

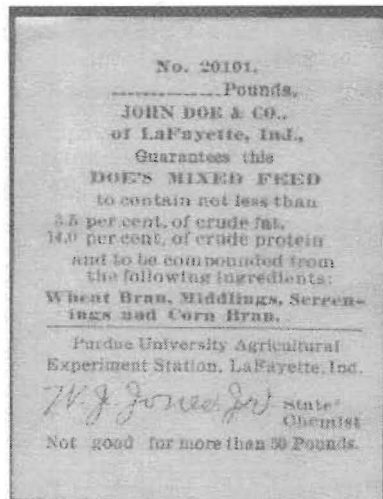


Figure 2. "No. 20101." Same as figure 1 except "----- Pounds" in lieu of weight at top. 50 lbs at bottom.

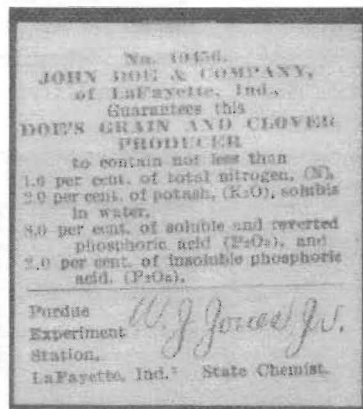


Figure 3. "No. 10456." at top. No weight listed. Height 45mm. On a somewhat translucent paper. "Purdue...." at left of signature.

Figure 5. "No. 4205" at top. Different bold font for "Purdue/University/LaFayette/Indiana" and "State Chemist". Different signature.

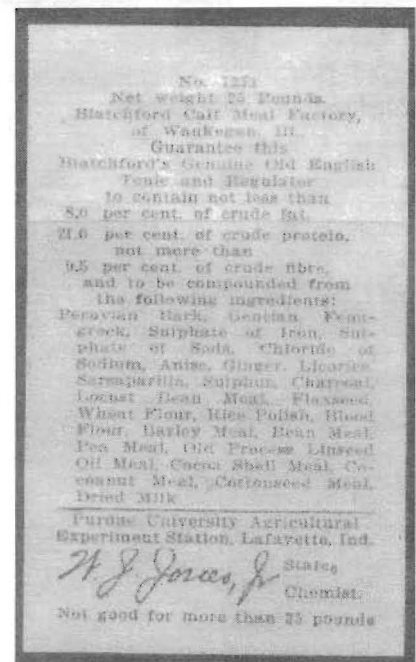
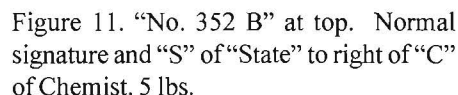
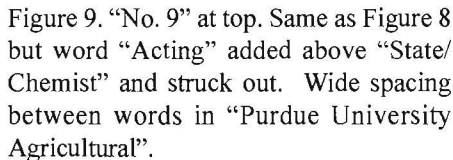
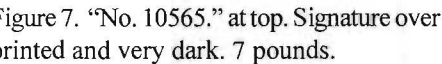


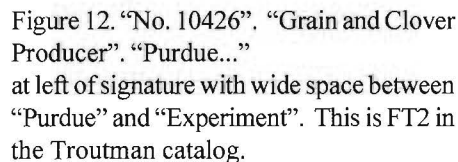
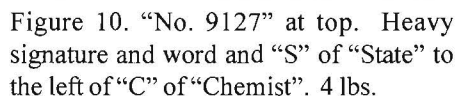
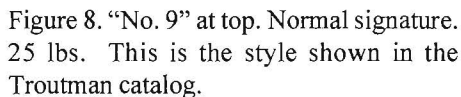
Figure 6. "No. 7271" at top. Tallest (82mm). "Purdue..." over signature. 25 pounds.

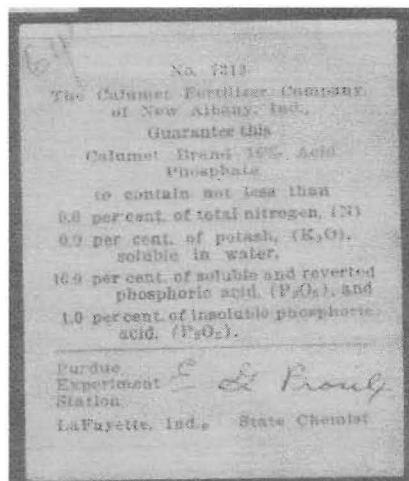
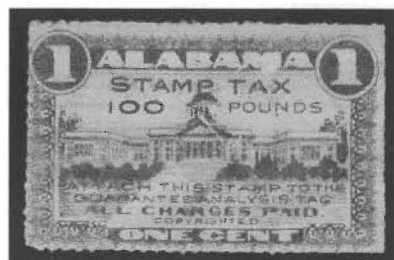


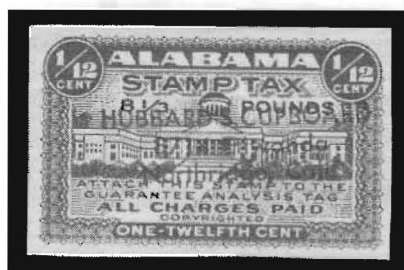
Figure 13. "No. 7312". "Calumet Fertilizer Company". Similar to Figure 12 but wide space between "Station" and "LaFayette" instead of between "Purdue" and "Experiment". This appears to have never been listed.

Alabama Feed Updates

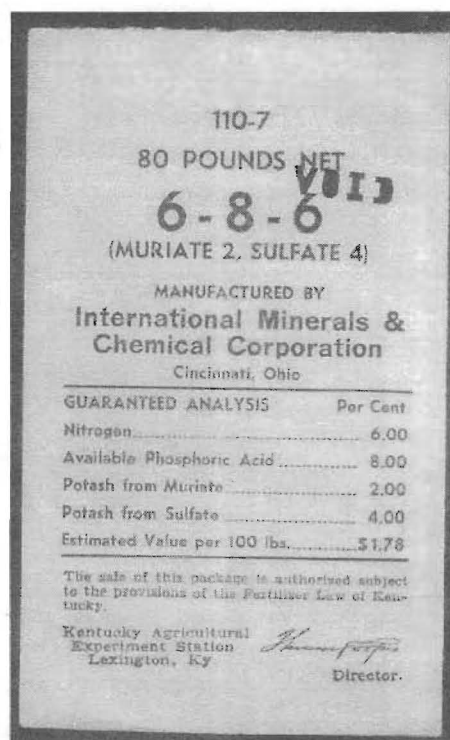


I am going thru my dupe album and saw this item, which I think I did not list in my catalog. I will call it F17A. It is just like the blue-green F17 except it is perforated 12.



Here is another cool item. Hubbard's Cupboard ad handstamp with his address on AL F58a imperf. I have seen the imperf stamp before and have added it to my catalog listing although it was not in my first editions.

In an article in 1967 Elbert Hubbard and David Stock indicated that Kentucky fertilizer tags existed but did not illustrate them. Mack Matesen has now uncovered an example of what we think they were talking about. This tag or stamp is very similar to the Indiana feed and fertilizer stamps, in that there is a number at the top, in this case "110-7", an analysis, and at the bottom an indication that the fertilizer is "authorized subject to the provisions of the Fertilizer Law of Kentucky." To the left is the wording "Kentucky Agricultural/Experiment Station/Lexington, Ky" that apparently did the analysis. To the right is the signature of the director, which I make out to be Thomas Papas(?). This is the same signature that appears on the Kentucky fertilizer stamps from 1943, so that may give an approximation of the date when these were used.

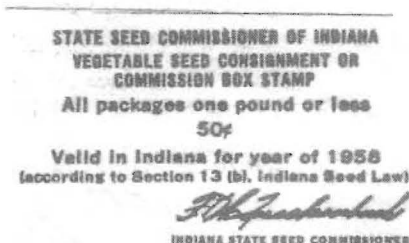


Like the Indiana feed and fertilizer this item is slit horizontally.

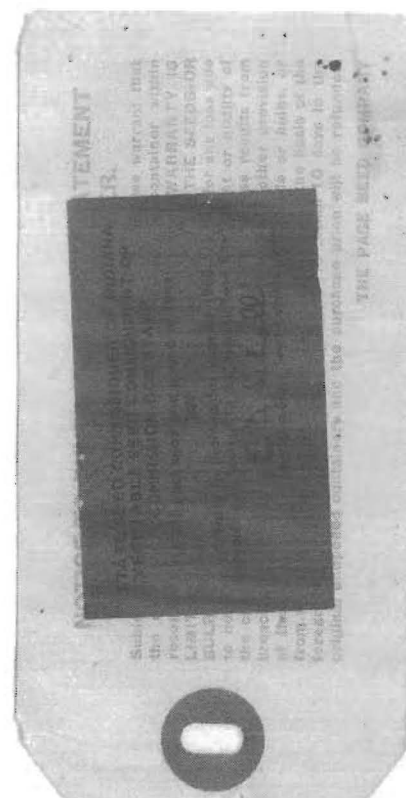
This item has a "VOID" handstamp on it, making it a specimen or remainder.

Indiana Vegetable Seed

The Indiana seed stamps were not illustrated in the new catalog. Mack Matesen has provided images of both the Quackenbush and Schall varieties. According to an article by Terence Hines in the Nov-Dec 1990 SRN these stamps were actually used on vegetable seed. F.W. Quackenbush served as Seed Commissioner from 1943-65 and from 1965 on E.D. Shall took over. The vegetable seed stamps began in 1957.

North Carolina Tags

I recently acquired the three feed tags shown which are not in the Troutman catalogs.

Figures 1 and 2 are 1933 tags colored black on brown with a brown grommet with Graham signatures for 25 and 75 pounds respectively. These would become FET12a and FET12b.

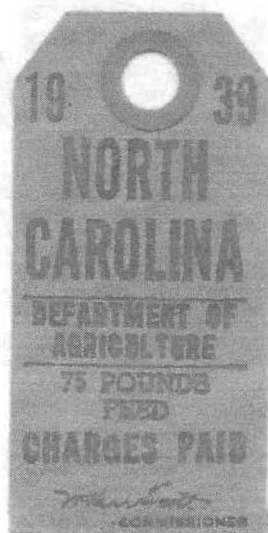


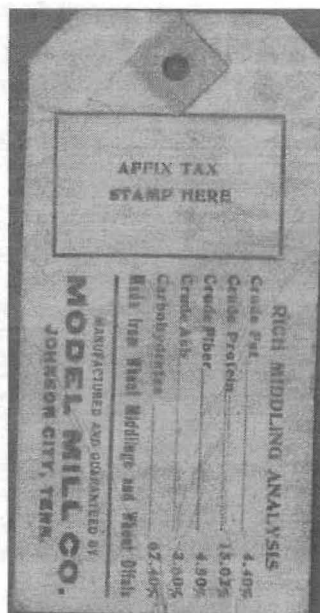
Figure 3. Blue on brown, red-brown grommet

Figure 3 is a 1939 tag with W. Kerr Scott signature but with unlisted colors blue on brown with a red-brown grommet. This is like FET18 but with a red-brown grommet.

Figure 4 is a fertilizer tag from 1910 like FTT1 but handstamped in purple for "250 POUNDS/FERTILIZER". This would become FTT1d. Must have been one big bag.

When I was rummaging through my tax tags I came across the attached. Somewhat interesting in that I've never seen any other tag where a space has been allocated for the affixment of the tax stamp. This one bears a 1910 3/4ct FE12 stamp, but on the other side.

Minnesota Feed Tag

This tag looks like Minnesota FET9 with the Dennison imprint on grommet, but the signature is Byron Allen and not Clark. This will become FET11. The "100 POUNDS" is in red, the other writing in green on a cream card.

Georgia Find

This little 3 cent light purple Georgia cigar and cigarette that came up on Ebay is something new. It is a coil, perforated 10 vertically but with the trees on the seal in the center. It also has a dated cancellation of 1932. It also has the imprint "FOOTE 7 DAVIES Co., ATLANTA GA." The only coils reported until now had the trees removed.

This will be CCG46A in the catalog

North Carolina Seed Tag Pair

Shown is an attached pair of seed tags from North Carolina. What is odd is that the tag on the right has a red "999" serial number while the other does not. These are on a manila stock about the thickness of a manila folder, with a dull red grommet. They came folded in a continuous ribbon, cut vertically except at the top and bottom, 1000 in a box. Possibly only the last one was numbered. These cost two cents each. Both have a blue handstamp of W.G. Weaver & Sons Seed Company of Winston-Salem. Weaver was a seed dealer selling to farmers and other seed stores. Many of the tags and stamps existent are known to have come from them through a contact someone had there.

These tags were never actually used as the analysis information has not been filled in. These are tags SET3a and SET3b. This same tag is more normally seen with a black serial number to the right of the grommet.

Jim Graham was agriculture commissioner from 1964-2000. My guess is that these were acquired before 1990.

South Carolina Feed Variety

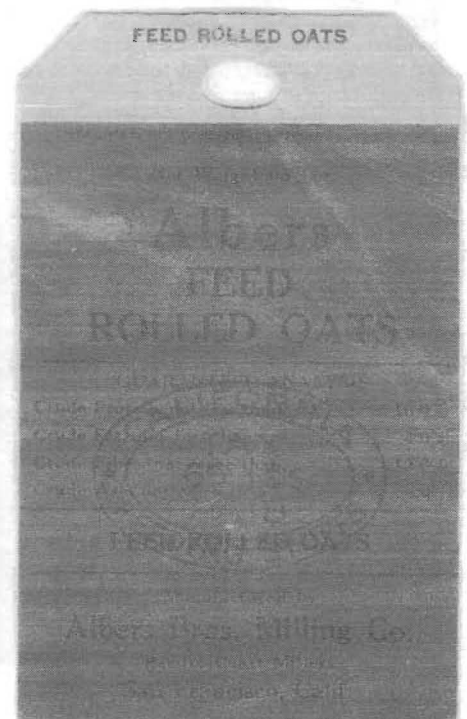
In the Hubbard catalog for South Carolina on the 1913-1916 feeds it mentions that there are many minor varieties. Shown is what looks to me to be a plate variety. On "SOUTH CAROLINA" at the top, the "T" and "H" are nearly missing, the "C" in "Carolina" is half missing and the "LINA" is unreadable. The plate seems to have heavy damage in the circular leaf motif all across the top and starting down the right side. This particular example is a Hubbard F16 or SRS FE16.



California 65 Pound Feed Tags

Shown on the cover and to the right are two California feed tabs for rolled oats. The one on the cover has the indicia in red, this one has it in black. This is a beautiful red tag I should note, which may make it a bit hard to see. This poundage is not listed as known in the new catalog and will become FET0.



Kentucky Feed Tags

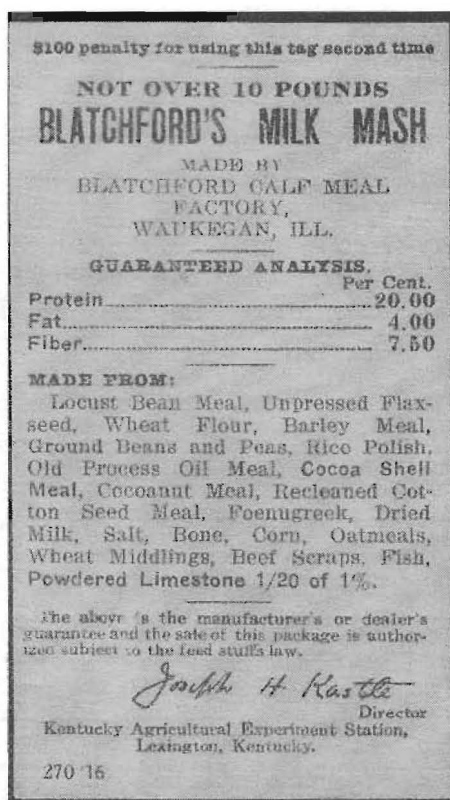

In the new SRS-Troutman catalog, it mentions that Kentucky feed tags exist but no pictures of any had been recorded. The two true tags below come from my tag collection, started with the assistance of the late David Strock. Frank Applegate, James Seville and George Cabot were the main source for these old tags.

In the lower left corner is a number, example 415'19. Cabot states "that these were register brand numbers and year date. There are numerous varieties". That makes the hard to read signature on these two from 1919 Thomas Cooper.

The other from 1916 is similar to the Indiana's feeds, more of a stamp than a tag.

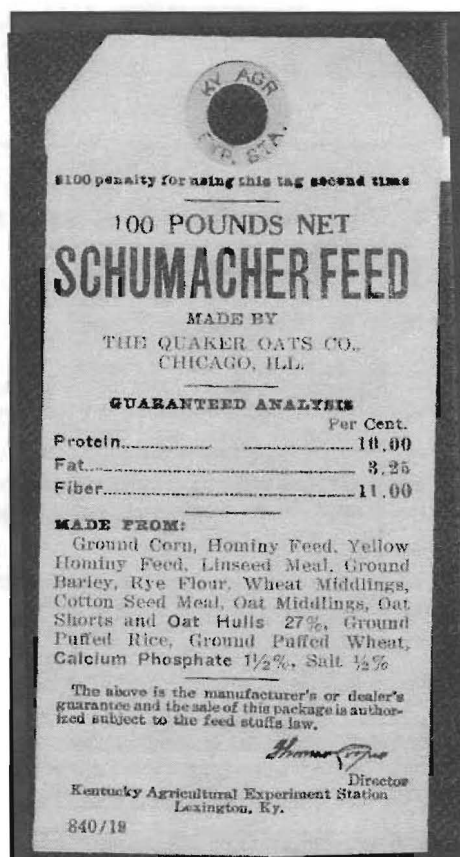

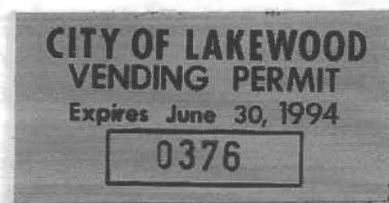

City-County Corner

The following are some California items sent in by John Boal.



This Lakewood vending permit is black on orange with a black serial number. It is imperforate and appears to be a self adhesive.

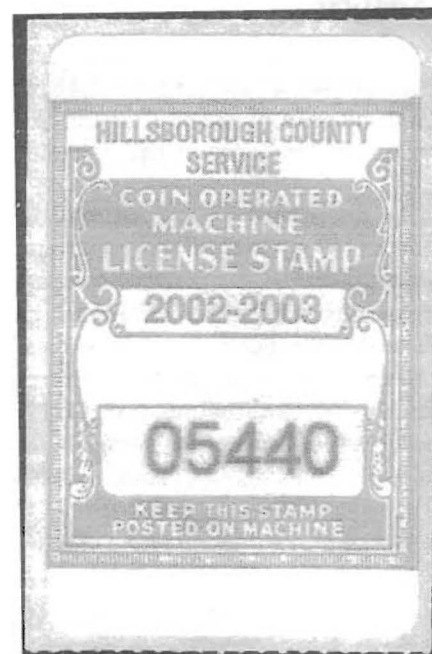


Here we have the black on bright yellow Glendale newsrack registration. Again it is imperforate and appears to be a self adhesive. John has no idea whether this is a tax item or showed you had gotten a permit of some kind. It is one of the stranger things we have seen taxed or registered.



This self adhesive is orange on white with a black serial number. This is known to have been used on video games

Kent Gray sent in the following from Florida.



This Hillsborough County coin operated machine stamp is a die cut self adhesive on a white backer. The stamp is green with pinkish-red serial numbers. The backer is rouletted 5-1/2 horizontally.



This die cut self adhesive vending machine stamp is red on white with a glossy white backer. The serial number and amount are written in with a ball point pen. This image is quite reduced and the stamp itself is 90x90mm to the edges. This appears to have been scissored off a roll horizontally.

Illinois Beers: Mysteries Solved and an Open Question

This article concerns two perplexing aspects of Illinois beer stamps, that I have considered open mysteries. Two I think I have solved, and another has presented itself.

The first question was what does the "SERIES NO. x" mean on the beer stamps, where the "x" is a number. In some discussions with Scott Troutman, he indicated he was beginning to think it was a printing number and he had concerns because he had included it in the descriptions of some of the stamps in the new catalog. I thought the numbers started out with the smallest size as "Series No. 1" and went up 2/3/4 for each stamp in series by size.



Series on a B19

Turns out we were both wrong. This is what happens when you don't look at a big enough sample. By pure coincidence, B7 - B11 follow this pattern and I thought there was a stamp missing because Series 2 was skipped - and of course these were the exact stamps I was looking at. About halfway through, I made a spreadsheet and it became obvious I had to stop looking at the individual series by year and look at the "big picture".

The "Series" number indicates the stamps denomination - they are all the same straight across the board for all years.

Here is the chart that came out of the spreadsheet I made.

There are a few stamps I don't have and couldn't find pictures of. If you have these stamps I need you to check them against this table and verify the series matches the denomination. B21, B36, B40A, B42A, B43, B66A, B71, B72 and B86.

I don't believe B84 exists. It is a duplicate of B80. They are both case stamps (24/12 oz. bottles is "1 Case") and B84 is out of order as far as size goes (from smallest to largest) and the order of all other series. B84 is not included in the grid and there were none in the Nutmeg sales. If you have differences from the grid, please let me or the editor know.

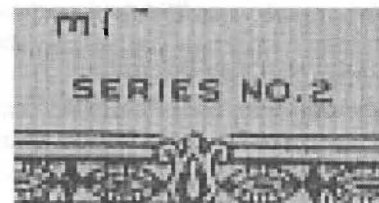
I may be the last person on earth who didn't know this, but I finally "cracked" the code on a another beer issue. For years I have been saving the 1943-52 Illinois beers

by letter (A,B,C) and colors if different. Not sure why I never noticed it before, but for the 1946-52 stamps, the letter seems to be the position within the pane.

For B37, the first two numbers are the position numbers.

One last question I have concerns the case and half case beer stamps from 1934 through 1943. Are all of the 1/2 case stamps 12/12 ounces and all the case stamps 24/12 ounces? In other states like Washington and Idaho you see other combinations like 12/24 ounce for a case or 6/24 ounce for a half case. Do any of these odd sizes exist on Illinois stamps and nobody ever noticed?

Check your collections and see if there are finds waiting to be uncovered.

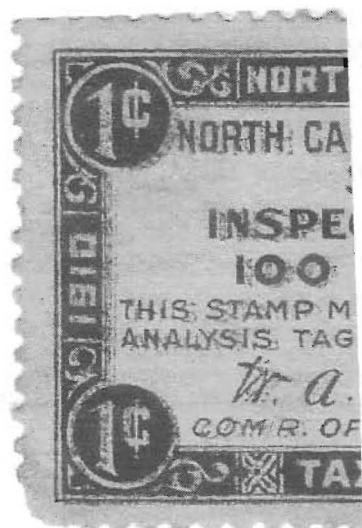

North Carolina Feed Fruit and Vegetable Inspection Stamp Varieties

Shown is an interesting variety of North Carolina FE13 the 1 cent 1910 stamp. The left side of the stamp shows either a double impression, double transfer, or some kind of wiping problem with the printing press. The word "THIS" and the inner left frame line is particularly noticable and also the "COM".



Mack Matesen sent in this 1921 FE97 used 3/4ct which is brown instead of red. This may be a color error as brown was the color for the 1/2cent.

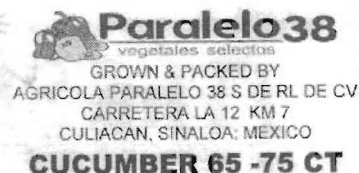
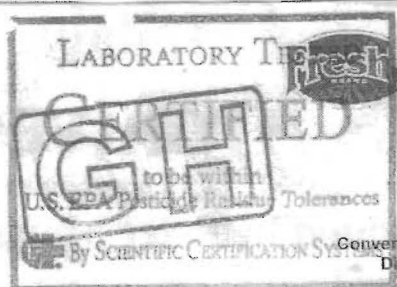

Frank Binder sent in a couple of items of interest. The Figure 1 shows an inspection handstamp on a carton of 65 to 75 cucumbers grown in Mexico. The black handstamp reads:

Laboratory Tested
CERTIFIED
to be within
U.S. EPA Pesticide Residue Tolerances
by Scientific Certification Systems

The cucumbers were distributed by "The Produce Exchange" in Livermore, California. I do not know if this inspection was done by Produce Exchange to insure meeting EPA standards or if this was done by customs.

Figure 2 is some Texas grapefruit, handstamped with a USDA inspection dated March 14, 2007. It indicates that the grapefruit is "Certified under all applicable Federal or State Cooperative Domestic Plant Quarantine/TX-104". This is similar to the older green and white quarantine labels that we have seen come through the SRS auctions from time to time.

Lastly, Figure 3 is a green Florida citrus label indicating the fruit had food coloring and fungicide added and was coated with shellac-based wax to make it look nicer. There is a domestic quarantine on this fruit imposed by the USDA. Apparently the people in Arizona, California, Hawaii, Louisiana and Texas along with most of the US protectorates want nothing to do with this fruit. These come in many styles and varieties. There is a lot comprised of these in Auction 41.

New York Considering Drug Stamps

I have excerpted part of an article in the January 24th 2008 New York Times sent in by Harold Effner.

"The Tennessee tax authorities slapped a young concert goer with \$11,506 in taxes and penalties when he was caught with marijuana-laced Rice Krispie Treats. North Carolina collected \$11 million in taxes last year on illegal drugs and moonshine. And in Alabama, the rate drug user who chooses to pay state taxes on a stash is issued a sticker to place on the package that declares, "Say no to marijuana".

"Strange as it may seem to levy a tax on a commodity that no one is supposed to have, 29 states have passed laws that impose taxes on illegal drugs and controlled substances, and on Tuesday Gov. Eliot Spitzer proposed that New York become the 30th.

"Across the country a variety of drug tax laws have sparked legal disputes over issues like the constitutional protection against double jeopardy and the weight of spiked baked goods -- as in the case of William Hoak, the Tennessee man who argued in court that he should have been taxed only for the weight of the marijuana in his Rice Krispie Treats, not for the cereal and marshmallows."

To avoid such problems new laws have been passed that allow the stamp purchaser to remain anonymous and selling agencies cannot go to the police.

"Paying the proposed New York tax - \$3.50 per gram for Marijuana and \$200 per gram for other drugs -- would not allow the taxpayer to keep illegal drugs, and the governor doesn't intend the tax to be a step toward drug legalization, said Robert Megna, who was confirmed as state tax commissioner on Tuesday."

The idea is if the police find a stash, "officials can then assess how much tax is owed and take it from cash found with the drugs or a dealers other assets."

So we may see a new set of tax stamps issued.

Best Research Article of 2007

Ken Pruess won for the best research article of the year for his piece on "New York Stock Transfer Tax: The First American Bank Note Company Printing" in the third quarter issue. This honor, voted on by the board of directors, carries with it a \$50 prize. It is a good example of great research done on some of the most common state revenue stamps.

Coming in second was Joe Jeter's article in the first quarter issue "1934 South Dakota Beer and Wine Stamps". It was one of several fine articles by Joe Jeter in the "Fractions of a Cent" issue.

Third was David Wrisley's article in the 3rd quarter on "Florida Citrus Control Stamps - Florida Control Committee".

Ira Cotton's piece on Paddlefish Licenses in the third quarter issue also garnered some votes.

There were lots of good articles to chose from this year and the best news was the appearance of new author's names to choose from. The SRN is only as good as the articles that come in, and we thank all the authors for taking the time to submit articles.

Whatever Happened to Arkansas B10 and Other Discussions on Improving the New Catalog

As a stamp auctioneer I am always amazed at what is the most sought after stamp. And with the new catalog I am equally amazed at what has stirred great furor and passion. Nothing has stirred up more comment than "What happened to Hubbard Arkansas B10 in the new catalog?"



Hubbard Arkansas B10 is an annoying stamp. It is made like an Arkansas liquor stamp, but has "Malt" overprinted brightly on it and to complete the picture it was used to tax beer. Hubbard when he did his catalog put it under beer. Elbert Hubbard's basic strategy in his catalog was to put items under what they were used to tax. In my new catalog, I tried to arrange stamps under what it says on the stamps. B10 is one of the reasons why. It has been in at least four different SRS auctions and in three it got listed as "malt unlisted", because looking at the stamp it looks for all the world like a liquor stamp overprinted for use on malt. When pictured black and white the word liquor looks bold, but in color "MALT" just jumps out at you. While the intention was to make a malt liquor stamp, it sure is a poor way to do it. And to make it worse it wasn't illustrated in the old catalog. So it is under malt as MA16 in the new catalog with a note that it was used on beer.

This has created flurries of e-mail, gnashing of teeth, and great lamentations in some quarters. "How could you do that?" "Have you lost your mind?" "Oh the terrible inconsistency!" As I would rather be beat senseless than renumber this catalog again it is going to stay there, at least for now, until we do a major revision. And do a revision we will. This catalog is far from perfect in its present state. People have made comments like "well why didn't Scott take another year and get the kinks out of it". The big reason is, I didn't have

another year to work on it. Obligations that have come upon me in other areas of my life have drastically eaten up my time. The alternative was come out with something now or sit it on the shelf, probably for years. That didn't seem like a good move with Hubbard out of print. I should note that Ken Pruess has already sent me two pages of additions/corrections to his Colorado catalog and he did take the time.

Part of what was expected was that I would be flooded with new finds, and corrections needed because either because I made typing mistakes, new stamps came out, lost stamps surface or new research shows what we have listed isn't right. And that is happening in spades. And I encourage it to keep happening. That's how we make it better going forward.

Some big gaffs on my part have surfaced and with this issue you will find Update 1, which will fix about 10 pages with big problems. This we are going to send out to everybody free of charge. These fix problems from giving stronger copyright recognition to a couple of huge problems with incorrect pictures or accidental omissions.

Wonderful stuff is surfacing. Delaware cigar specimens, Virginia cigar decals, tons of unlisted cigarette fusions and meters, and the most amazing thing I've seen yet, a Virginia marriage license stamp (on the back page of this issue). In Louisiana tobaccos we have a mess that we just haven't begun to figure out (stamps that exist that don't match the catalog and cataloged stamps that don't seem to have the right measurements).

With all this stuff raining in, we don't want to publish a major revision until we get it all incorporated.

Let me take an example that I got from Peter Martin and Ron Lesher. In the Pennsylvania soft drink stamps, the question was what is SD10a? Isn't it the same thing as SD18? And the description and picture of SD11 don't seem to match the write up. Also, how come you don't have a picture of SD23, because I know you got some from Ron a while back?

Well, I had to go back and reconstruct

what happened which takes a lot of time. Ron Lesher had written a key article on Pennsylvania soft drinks back in the July 1979 SRN. Hubbard's listings, by and large, don't have pictures. The July 1979 SRN was printed in green ink and it doesn't scan so good. That is where the picture of SD12 came from. Me and Peter both thought we had an SD10a, which was mentioned in a later article as something new. I think it was in Hubbard's old house organ the Interstate Cinderella and Revenuer - ICAR. Again no picture. Long story short, after getting a picture from Peter of SD11, looking at our stamps, and rechecking the literature, I don't think SD10a exists but is a poorly described SD18 and elsewhere in this newsletter I tell you to drop it. I have no clue what I did with my SD23 but I can't find it (and I still can't). That is why there is no picture. The upshot is we now have a picture of SD11, and better write ups on SD12 and SD13. And if you have pictures of SD20 on, we could use them.

The biggest problem so far, is when I get a message that someone has a copy of a seldom seen stamp that is a different color than the one in the catalog. There are two examples in the "Letters to the Editor". Did the old catalogs have the wrong color or is this something new? Hard to prove which it is unless someone has the old color.

To date I have changes big or small to about 150+ pages. And I don't have all of what has been reported incorporated. We had to do a second printing as we sold out, and were forced to just print the same catalog, errors and all, we put out with the first printing. That is just the way things timed out.

Long haul this catalog needs to become the SRS Bible - as important as the catalogs the perfin collectors have for their material or the Pre-cancel Society catalogs on pre-cancels. We would like to try to keep the individual state catalogs aligned with the big catalog. It is not obvious yet how or if we do that. Dave Wrisley is wrestling with that now on his Florida catalog. We are new as a society at having a catalog. We are kind of feeling our way here. We may make some missteps. So we encourage your input.

SRS Auction 40

This was the largest auction ever with 47 bidders (including a lot of new members) taking shots and many getting bargains.

Most sought after lot was lot 426 the SC cooked shrimp (est \$12/realized \$18). Other hot lots were 25 the Decatur Alabama tobaccos (\$1.50/\$3.25), 95 DC cigarette (\$1/\$1.75), 187 some KS eggs (\$6/\$7.75), 356 Pennsylvania Westinghouse

Valley deed (\$5/\$6.75), 443 SD transportation (\$20/23), 505 WI pharmaceutical liquor (\$30/\$79), 529 the cinderellas (\$5/\$14) and 533 the Lathrops Post (\$1/\$11).

Other lots with good realizations were Lot 98 an unlisted DE beer (\$15/\$24), 268 the NC paint and varnish (\$15/\$27), and 332 a PA bedding stamp (\$10/28.). Strong areas were PA local deeds and real estate (most went over estimate), bedding, liquor

(except Kansas), eggs, scale seals, Louisiana and Wisconsin. California, Indiana intangibles, and a lot of fish and game just weren't moving.

Lots 10, 15 and 16 were withdrawn as misdescribed.

As always * indicates winning bidder was willing to go higher, t indicates tie bids and bold indicates it went for above estimate.

Consignments for the next auction need to be in by August 1st.

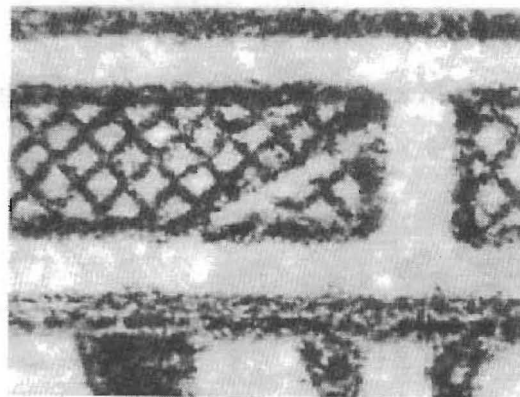

by Doug Davis and Kent Gray

Doug Davis noted that the New York Stock transfer stamp ST115 normally comes with a white line in the rectangle above "RAN" of "TRANSFER" whereas ST124 does not have this disturbance, and he was good enough to send along pictures. Note that not all copies of ST115 have this white line. Rather it appears to be damage to the plate at some point.

Kent Gray sent in the two examples of Specimens of ST155, the 1ct dark blue at left. The one on the left has a red SPECIMEN overprint the one on the right has a magenta overprint. The left specimen also has a small white "tick" mark or scratch in front of the word TAX at the bottom. I have blown this up. Kent wonders if this is a plate flaw and if so the position is immediately known given the specimen. Check your copies and see if you have one.

On 1918 oils, remove "on much whiter paper". Stamps in this set which are 110x44mm are OI19, OI19a, OI21, OI22, OI23, OI26. Note that all imperforate 1918 stamps are thought to be cut downs.

Header on Flannery feeds above set starting with FE96 should read "Double cross at lower left". On 1944 set it should read "Double cross removed".

L55 value should be 17-1/2ct.

Texas

L50 should be 25.6ct, not 26.6ct.

Pennsylvania Lake Erie Fishing Stamps

by Scott Troutman

Recently Peter DeSantis donated some Pennsylvania fishing licenses and two had on them special Lake Erie fishing permit stamps. To my knowledge, no one has reported these before.

The 1996 stamp is keystone shaped, black on orange and is put on the license over a small keystone logo of the Pennsylvania fish commission. On a full run of licenses, only the licenses for 1995-1998 denote this as a place for putting these stamps with the wording "Stick Lake Erie Permit Here". The 1996 stamp went for \$3. Apparently this early program was suspended until 2005.

In 2005 the Lake Erie Permit was reinstated. Having a Lake Erie permit allows you to fish in the Pennsylvania waters of Lake Erie, Presque Isle Bay and any tributaries of Pennsylvania rivers running into Lake Erie. People holding a life time fishing license do not require this stamp.

A basic resident fishing license in Pennsylvania currently goes for \$22 - a non-resident one \$52. If you wish to fish for trout or salmon you must purchase a trout/salmon stamp for an additional \$9. Adding the ability to fish in Lake Erie is another \$9. However, a combination trout/salmon and Lake Erie stamp can be purchased for \$15. The holographic stamp shown on the 2005 license is a combination stamp. I have not seen the Lake Erie stamp but it is apparently still keystone shaped based on the blank space for it on the license.

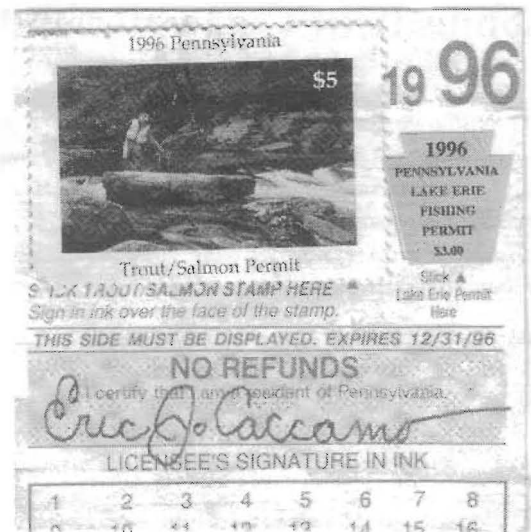
The Pennsylvania Fish Commission posts its sales for the current stamps on its website. Sales were as follows.

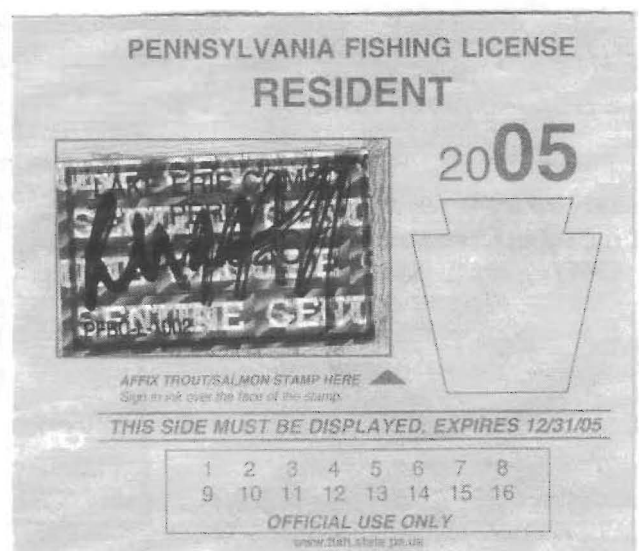
A few hundred Lake Erie or combination stamps were sold to non-resident anglers, primarily those from Ohio and West Virginia. Non-resident licenses with these stamps are thus quite rare.

I should note that in Pennsylvania children under 16 do not require licenses if a parent is with them helping them to fish (unless they are fishing too). The parent does not have to have a license either in that case. The same is true for people with mental or physical disabilities who cannot work a rod and reel themselves. Helpers again do not need a license.

Any Pennsylvanian who was a POW or who serves in the National Guard or military reserves pays only \$2 for the basic fishing license. The stamps cost the same.

Extra Fee for New Online Pa. Fishing Permit

This was sent in by E.E. Fricks from a newspaper identified only as the Inquirer (Philadelphia Inquirer?).

"Gov. Rendell has signed House Bill 1109 into law, resulting in a small license-transaction fee for anglers effective immediately, the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission said yesterday.

The Fish and Boat Commission and the Pennsylvania Game Commission are developing an electronic license-delivery system that will eliminate paper-based licenses for the 2008 fishing year, which began Dec. 1.

The system is managed by a private firm, which charges the Fish and Boat

Commission an 70 cent fee for each transaction.

The new law allows the commission to recover up to \$1 in electronic-processing fees from the license buyer. This means each license will cost the buyer 70 cents in addition to the basic license fee, currently \$22 for Pennsylvania residents."

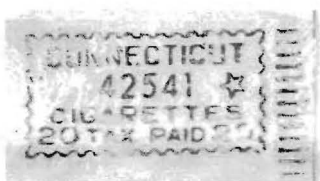

A Vermont Cigarette

Decal Discovery

Terence Hines



I picked up the illustrated item at a local stamp show. It is a Vermont 20 cigarette purple cigarette tax meter. The color indicates that it paid the 8 cent per pack of twenty cigarettes in effect from 1963 to 1965. Then there's the stamp. It is a 20 cigarette green water transfer decal, Troutman # C20. It was issued in 1963 to pay the 8 cent rate. Finally, there is the overprint on the stamp. It consists of alternating black and white bars running down the center of the stamp.

So, what the story here? My interpretation is that the stamp, in its overprinted version, was used to pay the additional 2 cent tax due when the per pack rate went from 8 cents to 10 cents in July of 1965. This would make the overprinted stamp a major variety, ideally listed as C20A.

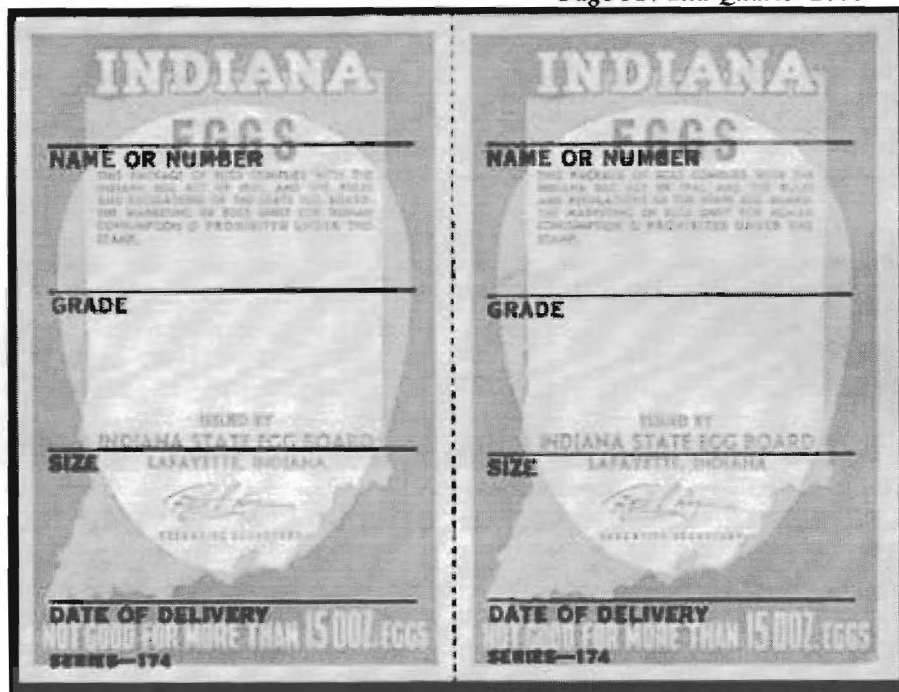
Indiana Egg Stamps

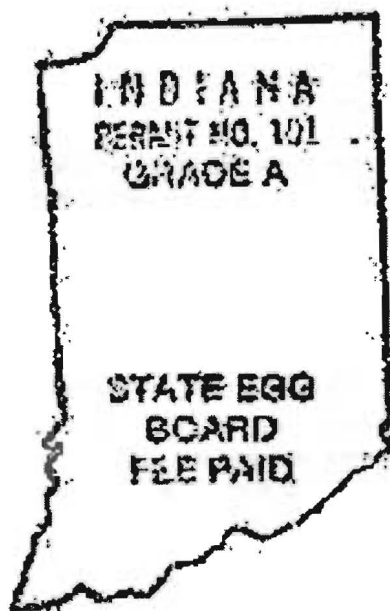
The listing of Indiana egg stamps in the new SRS catalog is based on the listing compiled by Troutman¹ with additions. I have several unlisted varieties which prompt this report. The law² which created these stamps was passed in 1941 and required one stamp per 15 dozen or fraction of eggs. Stamps were \$1.50 per 100 stamps. Ed R. Menefee was the first Executive Secretary of the Egg Board and his signature appears on the first stamps. I grew up in southern Indiana and we had a moderately large chicken operation. I can recall seeing 30 dozen cases with these stamps but at the time I didn't know anything other than postage stamps were collectible. It was many years later that I made an effort to obtain examples. Because 30 dozen was a rather standard wholesale crate, this explains why stamps were issued in pairs.

The 1941 law was amended in 1949³ to reduce the price of stamps to 75¢ per 100 for eggs which had been federally graded. The fee for eggs only State graded remained at \$1.50 per 100. The 1957 law⁴ increased the fee to \$2 per 100 stamps, \$1.25 per 100 if federally graded. Robert L. Hogue (not Hogan) became executive secretary in 1957 so this is when his signature first appears on stamps. Hogue continued in that capacity until 1984, after use of stamps had been discontinued. This law also authorized the use of handstamps and a reporting system as an alternative to stamps. Finally in 1981⁵ all use of tax stamps was discontinued. But it is possible that labels indicating size and grade may exist. It seems a bit odd that Menefee stamps would still be in use in 1967 as some are dated in the catalog, but I do have E24 clearly dated 1960.

I thank Candy Byers of the Indiana Egg Board for information on the executive secretaries. Unfortunately she could find no information which explains the different series numbers found on stamps. There does seem to be a chronological sequence based on known cancel dates or signatures. Obviously all were done by the same printer and perhaps these refer to printing records?

North Carolina Cigarettes

Larry Frederick wrote in February saying on a recent trip the cigarettes he purchased in North Carolina had no stamps on the celophane, only some smeary purple numbers (he sent examples and they appear to be distributor numbers or batch numbers). Tony Crumbley has verified that the fusions are not on current cigarettes being sold in the Charlotte area. The tax remains 35 cents per pack, the nations lowest. It appears the state has moved to a method of collecting taxes when received by distributors, possibly as far back as 1993. Since the tax was raised from 5 cents to 35 cents a pack in 2005 there has been an 18% reduction in cigarette sales in the state.

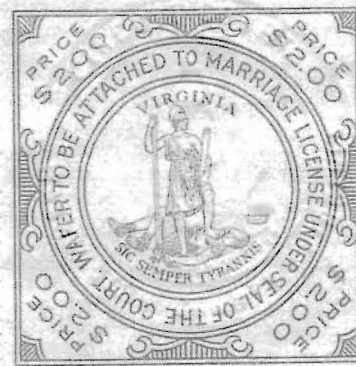

This Free-for-All is provided by fairly new member James Timpson. The 15 cent values of the Indiana intangibles can be hard to find, but he had a load of extras from various years.

Free-For-All items are provided as a benefit to members to enhance their collecting enjoyment. These are given away on a first come, first served basis and any left are sold through the sales service.



Virginia Marriage License Stamp

One of the most exciting new finds is reported by Pieter P. Bensen - this \$2 Virginia marriage license stamp. The stamp is blue on white with a design 46x46mm and seems to be perforated 12. This copy is used with an embossed Great Seal of Virginia and the wording "Circuit Court, Washington County, Virginia". This design is not as detailed as earlier tax on notary seal stamps so we do not know when it was used. It appears these were only used on license's issued by a court officer.



Unlisted Texas Drug Stamp

Pieter Bensen also sent in this illustration of an unlisted Texas controlled substances stamp for 50 dosage units and with a face of \$2000. This becomes DC2A in the SRS catalog. Like all the Texas drug stamps, this is black on a mirror like silver foil.
