

President's Notebook by Hermann Ivester

SRS Constitution

In the First Quarter President's letter I indicated that a new constitutation and by-laws for the SRS would be my first priority. However, the comments received upon circulating proposed language for a new constitution among Board members indicated that it would be very desirable for the SRS to qualify as a tax exempt organization under Internal Revenue Service Code § 501(c)(3). Presently, the SRS is qualified as a tax exempt, unincorporated association thanks to the efforts of Mack Matesen many years ago.

The main advantage to qualifying under § 501(c)(3) would be that donations to the SRS would be deductible on federal and most state income tax returns. This would apply to such things as contribution over and above the amount of dues or a donation of stamps to be sold in the SRS auction for the benefit of the SRS. I have been told that in the past the SRS has missed out on donations because a deduction was not available.

Despite this obvious benefit, qualifying under § 501(c)(3) also has disadvantages. To do so the SRS would first have to incorporate and thereby become a new legal entity before even applying under § 501(c)(3). Approval can take a long time and is not automatic. Without the approval, we would be better off as an unincorporated association. It is not clear yet whether we should apply for § 501(c)(3) status. When the Board decides on the best course of action we will present a new constitution and bylaws for your approval.

<u>Catalog Update Project and Email Addresses</u>

Much work is being done reviewing portions of the catalog. Drafts of an updated Florida catalog have been circulated to the Catalog Review Committee, and we anticipate that it will be ready for circula-

tion to other members by emailing it to those of you who have supplied an email address.

We initially anticipated that circulation by email would reach most members. However, we have email addresses for only a small percentage of you. As you can imagine, mailing review copies to most of the members would get expensive, and they would not be in color. Moreover, we know that not everyone will review all states. As I did in the 2nd Quarter President's letter, I urge you to please provide your email address (or one that you can access) to our Secretary, Kent Gray, kent@staterevs.com. If you do not have an email address and want to review the draft of the Florida Catalog (or other specific states) for the purpose of comparing it to your collection and providing input, write or telephone me and a copy will be mailed to you.

Review copies cannot be circulated by mail to all members due to the cost of copying and mailing. As stated last time, your email address will be used only for SRS business.

Work is also progressing on other portions of the catalog, although not as fast as we had hoped. Please be patient. I urge anyone who would like to work on updating any state or any category of stamps in any one or more states to speak up. Your participation would be very welcome.

Catalog Editor

Scott Troutman exerted a tremendous effort in making the first edition of the SRS State Revenue Catalog a reality, and is rightly given the lion's share of the credit for that accomplishment. Scott has chosen to hand the job of updates and future editions of the Catalog to a successor and has resigned as Editor of the Catalog. He will continue to serve as Editor of the SRN. Fortunately, we have a worthy successor


New Security Feature Being Used on Heat Fusions

Recently we have been reporting many new heat fusions as having a gray or gray black ink jet control numbers. We recently discovered that this is coming from a new security device apparently put into use about 1999. What is actually happening is that the control number is printed in black on the back of the fusion and appears gray from the front. It would seem a new attachment process has been created to allow this to be done as previously the control numbers were added to the fusions before attachment. This new process may apply the control number as part of the attachment process.

Larry, went back and reviewed his fusions and found examples in Pennsylvania stamps from 1999 (C66), 2004 (C72) and 2007 (C73). Stamps from Hawaii(C2), Massachusetts, Michigan, Oregon, South Dakota, and Texas all from 2007 have this property.

Seed Tag Paying Tax in Two States

I spotted this seed tag from Mayo's Seed because of the "SEED TAX PAID" in the lower right hand corner. However, on looking closer I discovered it paid the tax in both North Carolina and Tennessee. Just above the SEED TAX PAID in small lettering it says the following:

STATE OF TENNESSEE
DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
REPORTING PERMIT NO. 2
STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA
DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
REPORTING PERMIT NO. 4


You often see bedding tags with stamps or notations paying taxes in multiple states, but this is the first time I have seen it on a seed tag. A line at the bottom on the back Page 3 / 3rd Quarter 2009

below the analysis ends "TESTED 7-77". I am assuming this grass seed was tested July of 1977.

D.R. Mayo's Seed Company, according to an internet article in the Knoxville News Sentinel, is the oldest business in Knoxville, Tennessee having operated since 1878. It is a family business and has been operated by the Mayo family for six generations. In the 1970's they opened a second store in Fountain City, but it closed in the 1990's. Dan Mayo at age 91, the grandson of the companies founder, is a wholesale seed broker and still working. Apparently they do enough business in North Carolina to justify paying the double tax

Texas Stamps Still Ohio Malt Finds **Used At International Bridges**

I have long suspected that stamps might still be in use for taxable products brought into Texas from Mexico. This was confirmed when my daughter provided the illustrate stamp for 1/5 gallon of liquor taxed at \$1.00. This is a self-adhesive computer printed stamp with black text but central seal in light blue and yellow and bar code at bottom. Overall size is about 51 x 16 mm. Such stamps probably exist for beer and perhaps even cigarettes. I suspect the tax is largely ignored. Whether these stamps can be purchased without actually having the taxed product is unknown. Someone who lives close to the border should make an effort to obtain examples.

Ohio Beer Notes


In auction 44 and 45 in this issue we are selling a large run of Ohio beers from a collection that was found in Canada. These stamps have allowed me to create much better pictures and listings of the stamps. Copy this new listing on pages five through nine and replace them in your SRS catalog.

One of the most interesting new pictures is of B25, which has the small "S" hidden in its upper right corner of its webbing. The collector who formed this collection believed this stamp was produced by the Warner Simpson Company of Columbus, Ohio and the "S" was an indication of this. It seems reasonable, but I have no indication of when this was done. If you have stamps with the hidden S I would be curious to know when they were used if you possess copies that have some kind of date on them.

Another change is that I have switched in some of the descriptions, to using whether the sun has a rim or not on it. Hubbard used whether the clouds were made up of horizontal lines. In some cases the sun on the state seal is nothing but a blank space in the engraving. In other cases there is an arced line giving it a definate rim. My suspicion is that this is either a case of two different printing firms, or the engraving plate wore out and a second one was made. This is an area ripe for study. In the 1935 set there are values with both rimless and rimmed suns. Adding the wide seal border on B26 and B26a it is possible their were three different manufacturers of these stamps.

Ohio beers are one of the more difficult stamp sets to sort and these newer listings should make that easier.

Here is a set of relatively cheap stamps that could use a lot of study.

Library Notes

Barry Porter?s The State Revenuer

One reference in the SRS Library that is frequently overlooked, particularly by fish and game enthusiasts, is Barry L. Porter?s *The State Revenuer*.

Porter was a Hendersonville, Tenn., revenue dealer who specialized in fish and game stamps. He issued a series of pricelists that were later combined with his cataloging efforts. Most of the text was produced on his memory typewriter. Porter died in 2003. Porter had issued previous pricelists but, beginning in August 1992, he changed his format and began producing numbered *The State Revenuer* pricelists that he sold by subscription. The 5-1/4 by 8-1/4 inch lists were issued monthly until the January-February 1985 issue, when they became bimonthly.

The initial issue had 32 pages, a number that jumped to 36 pages with issue two and 44 with issue three. The May-June 1985 issue increased the size to 56 pages and the pricelist jumped to 64 pages with the September-October 1989 issue. Most of the pricelists have different colored covers, often with some fish and game artwork.

The first issue was priced at \$1. The price was raised to \$3 in January 1983, \$4 in January 1985, \$5 in January 1988, \$5.65 in January 1990 and \$6 in March 1990. Many of the early pricelists have photo plates, mostly of fish and game stamps. Most of the 1988-1989 issues have no photos. Beginning with #58, the November-December 1989 issue, many of the listings have photos with the description. Issue #64, the November-December 1990 pricelist, is the last bound-in copy.

As Porter developed his pricelists, he included references to his catalog numbering system, which he developed but which never gained a foothold anywhere else. Porter?s cataloguing efforts coincided with expanded descriptions that included design and perf measurements. While the majority of the listings are for fish and game stamps, there are still many listings for other state revenues, which he also sold. Specialists may well find an obscure reference or useful photograph that may aid in research. The photo quality is generally very good.

The library has five hardbound volumes of *The State Revenuer*. They include:

1982-1983 #s 1-16 1984 #s 17-28 1985-1986 #s 29-40 1987-1988 #s 41-52 1989-1990 #s 53-64

Beginning in 1991, Porter went to a catalog format for his listings. Number 65 covered Virginia (especially the Bear-Deer Damage stamps), Number 66 featured Virginia cities and the W states and Numbers 67 and 68 (issue price \$10 each) covered AL city and state issues. The September-October 1991 *The State Revenuer* (#68) is the last recorded issue.

Porter also produced monthly mail bid sales from October 1989 to at least March 1991 and these illustrated listings can be of interest to researchers.

Here is a 5 cent value of the magenta 2000 series with the state seal at left. (*CM0*).

Maine



Unlisted purple 20000 series from Maine. (*CM2A*).

Minnesota



This is the three cent magenta little brother to the newest Minnesota CM0. I recommend we renumber this entire run as earlier material has come out of the woodwork.

Mississippi



This four cent dark purple 20000 series meter is unreported (*CMI*).



So is this purple 20000 series meter with the value removed (CM2).

New Hampshire



This is a scan of Hine's CM11 which isn't in the SRS catalog. This meter is black. (CM11).

New Jersey



New Jersey 20000 series not listed in catalog (CM7A) in purple. This is like the 40000 series set with the stars at the sides.

A note on the stars to the sides of these. Not only have I noticed the stars can be rotated to various positions (8 different), but the stars can also be solid or hollow as well. I have a few that are opposite of the catalog. This observation applies to this design, which was used in other states as well. I don't think they should rate a separate catalog entry, but their existence should be noted.

New York



Here is an unlisted 20000 series two cent meter from New York (*CM1A*).



A different 20000 series meter in purple (*CM1C*). This design is also known in magenta (*CM1B*)

Ohio



Not sure what denomination this purple meter is (notice round bottom: 3 cent? 5 cent?) but the 20000 series isn't listed. (*CM2A*)

Oklahoma



Here is an Oklahoma 40000 series CM2 in black, an unlisted color (*CM2a*).

Rhode Island



This is the a copy of the CM3 in a bright magenta (CM3b). This color has not been reported.

Cigarette Vending Machine Decals

Delaware



Most people forget that Delaware has cigarette machine decals because they are so rarely seen. Gates Clarke sent in this example of CVM2 from 1967. It is red and black on a cream card. The decal measures 80x53mm.

Florida



This is Florida CVM1. Dave Wrisley notes that even though this is punch cancelled, it should not be given a specimen designation. This is for the year 1951-52, signed by James T. Vocelle and is black on blue with a white serial number panel.

Michigan



James Timpson spotted this" 1968 Tobacco Vending Machine" stamp for sale on Ebay in December 2008 where it sold for \$56, unfortunately not to Jim. Our guess is that these were used on cigarette vending machines, and this is a either a red decal, front facing, on a thin brown paper backer, or a self adhesive with adhesive on the front, made to stick on the front glass of a cigarette vending machine. If any of the readers won this, tell us more about it, including its size.

New Jersey



Timpson also spotted these two New Jersey cigarette vending machine stamps which are much earlier than what had been reported. The 1964 decal is black on brown, and the 1967 decal is black on blue green. Both have black serial letter and numbers on white serial number panels (different sizes) and are on plain pale yellow cards. Cigarette vending decals are known used through 1976. One speculation is that the serial letter may be connected with the year. If so, these may exist back to 1959. These both sold for \$26.

New Nebraska Pickle Card Stamp by Kenneth Pruess

The Pickle card law was modified in 20071. Approved April 4, it probably became effective in September when licenses had to be renewed. Although other fees were changed, there was no change effecting stamps. However after the supply of old stamps was exhausted, the State had a new stamp prepared with text noting the change in the laws.

The new stamp is black on glossy white, die cut self-adhesive. Overall size 63 x 19 mm.

The State seems to order new stamps in multiples of 10,000 which take several years before all are used. These stamps still have a monetary value of only 10¢ but can be sold only to licensed distributors. Their primary function is to identify the set of cards as meeting legal requirements for Nebraska. Other States have similar stamps but most use the term "pull-tab" for this form of gambling. There are undoubtedly many unlisted stamps in this category. In some cases the laws are such that even used copies are difficult to obtain. Fortunately Nebraska has no auditing laws on the posters on which stamps are used and once all cards in a deck have been sold, the posters can be destroyed.

For the fish and game folks, there are some early Wisconsin ducks, Wyoming conservation stamps and a couple rarely seen Maryland big game.

Bidders need to watch for minimum bids on better material. A bid below miniumum is no bid at all.

Consigners have been sending in quite a few US duck stamps on and off license. With rare exceptions, this material tends not to sell in this auction, and when it does it goes cheap. Great buys are to be found. But I will send back wounded ducks, as this just doesn't seem to be the venue for selling them.

Utah Beer and WWII

As World War II progressed there was more and more need for help from those back home. That help was manifested in many ways but maybe one of the least known was promoting the sales of war bonds and saving stamps via the consumption of beer. Inventive as they were, several breweries were to pay their Utah "tax due" on every bottle of beer and at the same time say "We can help as well". How? Promotion.



By doing so every bottle of beer carried a label somewhat akin the one shown with the hope it would encourage the beer drinking public to buy bonds and saving stamps. Breweries such as Pabst employed neck labels that were surprisingly similar to those which carried the applicable Utah state tax medallion. Most, would have their "brand" label applied to the upper part of the bottles neck (i.e. from whence comes the term "long neck's") and the requisite tax medallion which was incorporated into the breweries own label, often applied just below or shall we say in parallel.

Breweries known to have used labels which were similar to their tax medallion labels included Pabst, as well as Fisher's out of Salt Lake City and out of state as well, and Walter's from over in Colorado.



Wisconsin Beer Note

I think the picture in the SRS catalog for the 1941 Wisconsin beer sereis is incorrect. Above is a scan of B41. Note where the "FERMENTED" and "TAX" sit in relation to the crest and denomination.

The picture in the catalog is from the longer beers which begin with B50 and run through B53. These are 133x32-1/2mm. The smaller values are 96x33mm like the B41 shown. The same is also true of the 1942 set. I'll change to show both.

Georgia Beer Laws

by Kenneth Pruess

Our library has disposed of old compiled statutes for Georgia (called Georgia Laws), making the search much more difficult. Some are available on microfilm but time consuming to search. Here is what I found. Effective dates not stated in all laws. I could not find when beer stamps were discontinued but I think it must have been soon after the 1964 tax increase and reverted back to the original 1935 reporting method. Compiled statues had extensive citations and no laws after 1964 which specifically discontinued stamps. Note that there was a tax reduction in 1951. Thus only the last set dated 1965? is clearly out of order.

1935. Malt beverage:excise and license. No. 207, pp. 73-81. Approved March 23. Only beer not over 6% alcohol permitted. Tax \$1.25/31 gal. barrel. Sugject to special election on May 15. Tax paid by reports.

1937. Malt beverage tax law amended. No. 471, pp. 148-154. Approved March 30. \$2.50/31 gal. or proportionally. Provides for stamps and tax paid crowns or lids.

1937-38 Extra Session. Malt beverage - amount of tax. No. 10, pp. 173-174. Approved Dec. 13, 1937. \$4.50/31 gal., 2ct per 12 oz or fraction. This would have permitted stamps only in multiples of 2ct for bottles or cans. To be in effect until June 30, 1939 when tax reverts to 1935 rate.

1937-38 Extra Session. Malt beverages - crown tax rate. No. 404, pp. 175-176. Approved Feb. 16, 1938. Tax changed to 2ct per 12 oz or proportionally for other sizes. Thus odd denominations case into use and continued to the end.

1939. Malt Beverage - amount of tax. No. 307, pp. 101-103. Approved March 24. Tax \$4.50 per farrel, 2ct per 12 oz or proportionally. This nullifies rate reduction provided in 1937-38.

1949 Extra Session. Taxation of malt beverages and wine. No. 233, pp. 356-359. Effective July 30, 1949. Tax increased to \$9.00/barrel, 4ct per 12 oz.

1951. Taxation of malt beverage and wine. No. 223, pp. 356-359. Approved Feb. 20, 1951. Tax reduced to \$4.50/ barrel, 2ct per 12 oz.

1955. Extra Session. Malt beverages - taxation. No. 5, pp. 23-25. Effective July 1, 1955. Tax increased to \$9.00 / barrel, 4ct per 12 oz.

1964. Revenue - malt beverage excise tax. No. 536, pp. 60-61. Effective March 1, 1964. Tax increased to \$10.00/barrel, 4-1/2ct per 12 oz. Because this was an amendment only of tax rate, there is no mention of stamps.


1977. Malt beveage tax amended. No. 652, pp. 1154-1160. Provides for refund for liquor and wine stamps. Presumably beer stamps were discontinued at some earlier date.

Also found some very complex laws on requirements for local beer taxes. That would be another story.

PEQAP - Is This the End?



Since the middle of 2008 I have noticed that one of the nine PA preferred program members (Martins) no longer displays the PEQAP (Pennsylvania Egg Quality Asssurance Program)symbol on their egg cartons. This has been noticed on the medium, large, extra large and jumbo boxes of eggs.

Could this be the beginning of the end of the PEQAP symbol on top of the boxes?

At the Pennsylvania Farm Show in January 2009 the PEQAP program was still being touted by the Department of Agriculture and you can also find much information on the Department of Agricultures web site. All the cooking demonstations involving eggs at the Farm Show used PEOAP inspected eggs. The program involves a rigourous continuous inspection program to prevent salmonilla from getting into eggs. Apparently Martin's has lost their certification, and as such the right to display the PEQAP symbol on their eggs, or they may have dropped out of the program. In late May 2009 I saw Martin's boxes and the symbol was still missing.

NC Cleaning and Pressing

In the Cabot and Hubbard catalogs it says that the 1933 issue was perforated 12-1/2 and that the 1934 issue was rouletted 6-1/2. They are reversed in the Troutman North Carolina catalog and the SRS catalog.

Wisconsin 1941 Beer Stamps and other errors

In the 1941 beer stamps a note needs to be inserted about the size of the high values, which are similar to the later sets. Also items such as B43P without a serila number and a security punch, most itmes similar to this you have called Specimens but these are noted as proofs. I think Specimen would be more accurate. I have a B53P or S without serial number and two security punches.

Also Utah beer B6 is blue not violet. This is an error in the Matesen catalog where it is listed as violet but blue in the illustration.

In California documentaries I have DN59a in a strip of four. DM83 I have on a bluish paper in a strip of four. It originaled from the Hubbard/Nutmeg auctions where it was listed incorrectly as on white paper. D33 should red \$3 red, not \$2.
