MONTANA HUNTING STAMPS - Mr. Applegate informs us that this state has had archery hunting license stamps since 1955 and he has shown us five of the seven stamps which have been used during that time.

He further informs us that these are still available - that is the five shown us - in sets from the Montana Fish and Game Commission. The stamps for the other two seasons are not available and there is only a small supply of the others left.

They are available in sets, without charge, but only one set to a person. Send your request at once, with a stamped addressed envelope, to

This is another instance of stamps being used without collectors knowing of them.

The stamps we have seen are all printed in black on white paper and are inscribed "Bow and arrow hunting license." The value in each case is \$2.00. All are perforated 12. Each has an inscription stating that they are void April 30 in the year after they were issued.

The stamps are all about 31 or 32mm. by 47 or 48mm. overall, some in a vertical design and some horizontal, as follows:

- 1956-57 Horizontal design, indian with bow in his hand
- 1957-58 Horizontal design, hand grasping bow, arrow ready to be discharged
- 1960-61 Horizontal design, bear with mountains and trees in background
- 1961-62 Vertical design, hunter kneeling, facing left, with bow drawn
- 1962-63 Vertical design, hand grasping bow with arrow in place and Montana map in background

ILLINOIS CIGARETTE STAMPS - Dr. Pruess shows us a used copy of what appears to be one of the heat sealing types as the safety design shows on the cellophane beside the stamp but not on the back of it. It is black on pink, squareish overall size about the same as the other heat sealing stamps, with the state seal on a white background in the top center, "20" in circles at both sides of the seal, "ILLINOIS/20 CIGARETTE /CIGARETTESTAX" below. The words "ILLINOIS" and "CIGARETTES" are in colorless letters on black while the other part of the inscription is in black. Dr. Pruess says these are almost impossible to get in decent condition when used. He also shows us the meter in current use, in violet, the common size and type with wavy line around the inscription "ILLINOIS/* 26670 */CIGARETTES/20 TAX PAID 20" and the specimen seen has a series of diagonal lines about 2 mm. beyond the right edge of the design.

TEXAS MATURE CITRUS FRUIT - Mr. Zimmerli shows us the 1962 stamp from this state, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ magenta on white paper, rouletted $6\frac{1}{2}$ in the familiar design with the year date in the center. These may be purchased at face value from:

UTAH FEEDING STUFF stamps mentioned in the August Newsletter are no longer in use by the State and may be purchased at \$1.00 per sheet of 100 stamps --- The stamps that are available are $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢, 10¢, and \$1.00. Those members not wanting to purchase the stamps in sheets of 100 may obtain them from Mr. R. H. Zimmerli, 313 N. Main Street, North Syracuse, New York, for 30¢ in coin and a stamped self-addressed envelope for the set of three stamps.

WEST VIRGINIA HUNTING AND FISHING STAMPS - Mr. Zimmerli has furnished us with a copy of information supplied him by the State on licenses and stamps still being available from the Department of Natural Resources, State of West Virginia, Charleston, West Virginia at \$1.00 per book. For those not wishing to buy entire books, he (Mr. Zimmerli) has obtained a supply of the 1960 and 1961 issues of stamps and is able to supply members with a set of 12 for \$1.50 and a stamped envelope.

Big Game and Trout Stamps were discontinued July 1, 1961.

The National Forest Hunting and Fishing Stamps were first used in 1951, and the Big Game and Trout stamps were first used in 1960.

MISSISSIPPI MINERAL DOCUMENTARY STAMPS according to a letter from the State Tax Commission, may be purchased from the Chancery Clerk, Hinds County, Jackson, Mississippi, and are available in denominations of 1¢, 3¢, 5¢, 20¢, 50¢, \$1.00, and \$5.00.

MISSISSIPPI TOBACCO STAMPS may not be sold to anyone but wholesalers. Their order blank shows the following as being available in September, 1962:

The order blank is divided into two sections, the top marked "Tobacco Stamps" ends after the Fuson 8¢, and the bottom section is marked "Adhesive," the first apparently being decals.

MISSISSIPPI BEER AND WINE STAMPS also cannot be sold to anyone but licensed dealers. The order blank shows the following:

MISSISSIPPI FEED AND FERTILIZER STAMPS have been discontinued and the Department of Agriculture no longer has any available.

MASSACHUSETTS ARCHERY STAMPS are available for purchase for the years 1960, 1961, and 1962. The first issue of these stamps was in 1960 so the complete set is available. All are in \$1.10 denominations. They may be had from the Division of Fisheries and Game, 73 Tremont Street, Boston 8, Massachusetts.

CALIFORNIA FISHING STAMPS - Available from the California Department of Fish and Game, 722, Capitol Avenue, Sacramento, California are the following. Payment must be accompanied by a self addressed stamped envelope, and stamps are not accepted in payment. Purchases of outdated stamps must be in full sheets.

California Fishing Licenses stamps in sheets of 5 are available for the years 1958, 1959, 1960, and 1961 at \$1.00 per sheet of 5.

Colorado River Special Use Stamps in sheets of 2 are available for 1957-1958 and 1958-1959 and 1959-1960 and 1960-1961 series at \$1.00 per sheet of 2 stamps.

DELAWARE TROUT STAMPS may be had at face value of \$2.10 from the Board of Game and Fish Commissioners, Dover, Delaware. Back issues available are 1958, 1960, and 1961.

KANSAS QUAIL AND UPLAND GAME BIRD STAMPS - The Forestry, Fish and Game Commission writes under date of October 11, 1962, that the quail stamps were started in 1938 and were issued up through 1960. In 1961 an Upland Game Bird Stamp was established and replaced the quail stamp.

The quail stamp sold for 50¢ a piece and the Upland Game Bird stamp sells for \$1.00. They do not reduce the price for collectors for outdated stamps, but they are still sold for the face value.

Stamps are available for every year except 1939, 1941, 1942, 1944, and 1945. The address of the Commission is Pratt, Kansas.

MICHIGAN TROUT AND BEAR STAMPS may still be had from the Department of Conservation, Lansing 26, Michigan. The law prohibits sales for less than face value.

Bear stamps were issued in 1959 through 1962 at \$2.00 each

Park permits were issued in 1961 and 1962 at \$2.00 each.

SOUTH CAROLINA TAX COMMISSION appears to have changed its mind and will now sell stamps in any desired quantity. Their order blank says that decalcomania stamps are printed in sheets

of 100 each, and that bedding stamps are sold only in multiples of 250 stamps.
