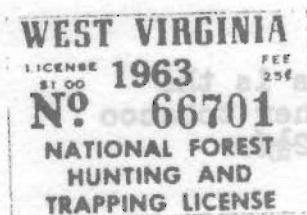

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## CIGARETTE TAX INCREASES THIS YEAR:

KANSAS - from 46 to 6¢ per pack April 1, 1964

GEORGIA - to 8¢ March 1, 1964

RHODE ISLAND - to 8¢ June 1, 1964

COLORADO - a new tax of 3¢ July 1, 1964.

MISSISSIPPI - 9¢ per pack July 1, 1964. This is the highest of the state taxes. Other tobacco products tax will increase by 12½%.

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## TENNESSEE REVENUE STAMPS

We quote the following from a letter shown us by Mr. Hubbard, written to him by Mr. N. Brickell Watkins, a student at the University of Tennessee:

"I have never seen a Tennessee tax stamp on a beer can, carton, or case. It might have been so several years ago but I don't think so at the present time.

### Decals: Liquors

Ammunition (The wholesale houses by tradition, do not apply these, but just include them in the case. Therefore, a carton of "22" shells will have a sheet of 10 decals on kraft paper - the smaller dealers, especially those in rural areas, rarely go to the trouble to attach these. They should be fairly easy to obtain.

### Pressure sensitive labels:

Vending machine tax labels (\$3.00 per machine)  
business card size.

Pump (i.e. gasoline) inspection labels

Scale inspection labels

The last two much smaller than the vending machine labels and issued by the Department of Agriculture, Division of Weights and Measures.

### Perforated "stamps":

Each case of dog food

Each sack of livestock feed (sewn through the middle and attached to analysis I. D. tag)

These two are the same stamps and approximate commemorative stamp size.

Each carton of chewing tobacco

Each individual cardboard box of snuff

Either carton or individual can or glass container of snuff

Each box of cigars (or can)



Each carton of smoking tobacco (pipe)  
This group of stamps for tobacco, etc, are much  
smaller with "wild" fractional denominations  
of all sorts.

Each cigarette pack is "stamped" in one of the two  
ways shown by enclosures.

#### FRANK L. APPLIGATE

Although this is the April issue of the Newsletter,  
it is late, being written in June. Word has just  
been received through Mr. Beaumont that Mr. Applegate  
passed away on May 31st.

He wrote us in early May that he had been laid up for about  
a month, in the hospital for a few days, but said he was  
gaining slowly.

Mr. Applegate was a fine gentleman and will be missed by  
all who knew him. He was one of the pioneer state revenue  
collectors and had a hand in compiling most of the catalogs  
of such stamps that have been issued, in addition to  
publishing a couple of his own on excise revenues.

He had sold all of his stock to Mr. Hubbard a short time  
ago except for hunting stamps and the Pennsylvania local  
documentaries in which he was very much interested.

He has been one of our main sources of information on new  
issues and we still have some information he gave us which  
we have yet to use, and we will certainly miss his help.

#### McKEESPORT, PENNSYLVANIA, DEED TRANSFER STAMPS

We have been shown a set of these, all in used condition.  
In our listing we gave the perforation as  $12\frac{1}{2}$  x 12, which  
seems to apply only to the \$1.00 value which is the only  
one in our collection. The \$1.00 in this set is also  
perforated  $12\frac{1}{2}$  x 12, but all the other values are 12 all  
around. There are some a lighter shade than others also, but  
whether this is the way they were printed or results from  
soaking off the document we cannot say. They are:

\$1.00 gray blue	\$10.00 light blue	\$100.00 dark blue
\$2.00 dark blue	\$20.00 light blue	
\$5.00 dark blue	\$50.00 dark blue	

Can anyone else inform us on the shades?
