- The Motor Fuel Tax Division of the Missouri Department of Revenue issues two inspection stamps for each gasoline pump inspected annually. The stamps are multicolored black, green, and red and of the pressure sensitive decal type. Validating is done by the inspector at the time of the inspection, and one stamp placed on each side of the pump inspected.
