



CALIFORNIA LOCAL CIGARETTE TAXES ? - This question is posed by information sent by Mr. Strock taken from the March 1966 Newsletter of California State Board of Equalization on Sales and Use Taxes which implies that some cities have a cigarette tax in addition to the State tax. Neither Mr. Strock nor your editor are familiar with these. Can someone supply additional information? We quote from this publication: "The December 1965 News Letter pointed out that some cities impose a local cigarette tax directly on consumers; that such tax is collected from consumers by retail sellers; and that in such instances, the local cigarette tax does not constitute a part of the retailers gross receipts subject to the sales tax. Apparently some retailers were not aware that some other cities impose a local cigarette tax on distributors at the wholesale level, in the same way that the State cigarette tax is imposed. A local cigarette tax that is imposed on distributors or retail sellers, and not directly on consumers, constitutes a part of the retailers' gross receipts subject to sales tax. It is suggested that retailers in cities that impose a local cigarette tax contact their city authorities to determine whether or not the local cigarette tax (for their particular city) is imposed directly on consumers."

Here is the statement in December 1965 News Letter (Calif. Board of Equalization): "Some California cities impose local cigarette taxes upon consumers (usually 2¢ per package) in addition to the state cigarette tax of 3¢ per package which is imposed upon distributors at the wholesale level. The city ordinances contain provisions requiring retail sellers to collect the tax from the consumers. The local taxes in such instances do not constitute a part of the retailer's gross receipts subject to sales tax."

STATE TAX TAGS

David C. Strock and Elbert S. A. Hubbard

Very little is known about the feed, fertilizer, etc. tags which were the fore-runners of many State inspection fee stamps. In some cases the law stated that either stamps or tags could be used and in some cases the law specified "labels", which could have been either stamps or tags in many cases. Following is a compilation of some data extracted from past laws covering the inspection stamps, tags, or labels.

COTTON SEED MEAL, 1905 - Tags authorized at 20¢ per ton fee. No known stamps. Tags known 1935-42.

NORTH CAROLINA ILLUMINATING OIL, 1909 - Tags or stamps authorized at 1/2 per gallon fee. Stamps listed from 1909.

VARIAN FEED, 1907 - Tagm at 25d per ton fee, repealed in 1911. Stamps

OHIO FEED, 1934? - Tags known.

OKLAHOMA FEED, 1938? - Tags known.

SOUTH CAROLINA FEED, 1910 - Stamps authorized at 25¢ per ton fee. Stamps listed from 1910.

SEED, 1909 - Stamps authorized.

FERTILIZER, 1942 - Tags known.

TENNESSEE FERTILIZER, 1938? - Tags known.

FUR TAX, 1939 - Tags known for opossum and muskrat.

FERTILIZER, 1901 - Labels authorized at 40¢ per ton fee.

WISCONSIN OLEO - Wisconsin's ban on the sale and manufacture of colored oleomargarine has been repealed. The new tax rate is 5 3/4¢ per 1b. on both white and colored. The tax is to last five years, with \$1 million a year in proceeds to be used for a dairy research building at the University of Wisconsin. 
