## NEW YORK STOCK TRANSFER VARIETIES

Charles H. Hermann

The New York Stock Transfer Stamps are a fine lot but too common for some to collect. Double transfers can be found on most of the 170 listed varieties with enough looking. Wish we could get a New York Stock Transfer Study Group going so we could have mats as the "Shift Hunters" had.

There are some fine double transfers on the 1905-6 issues which aren't mentioned in the catalog. I do not think the second one you sent has been described (in reference to 2 double transfers). Doubling shows clearly in upper left frame and upper left corner. I also have this on 1905 yellowish or 'straw' paper and on 1906 perforated issue with green overprint (see illustrations). The other one you sent was written up and illustrated in September 1965 American Revenuer. We will illustrate the bottom half of this stamp on the next page. Doubling is very prominent with an entire extra line inside right frame, in "DOLLARS", and outside of lower part of left frame just to mention some areas.

There are also a few recuts worth looking for. The \$1.00 blue 1905-6 type has a heavy cut at pearls upper left side of circle.

The catalog should have had a cut heading 1907. This type 1907-15 has some beauts and not one listed. The illustration on the following page will do to show this type and also shows a printing defect. The white areas in borders, around "NEW YORK", etc. look like much pulled or dry ink or dry paper.

Double Transfer on 1905 \$2

Now the 1916-45 designs are full of re-cuts and double transfers. On 1916 \$2, horizontal lines in left 2 double. Also recut left frame (lower 1/3), etc. Also the \$2 violet with recut lower right frame about half of bottom row. Also stamp no. 6 in sheet of 100 (#1 in UR pane of 25) has left frame heavily recut (illustrated below).

1964 Resident Hunting Stamps

All designs same as 1963 stamps. All year dates and serial numbers in red except as noted. Due to malfunctioning printing device many year dates show only partial numerals. The shear used to cut sheets into panes left many stamps with imperf edges with small nicks resembling two gauge rouletting. For several values as listed below the printer used more than one gauge rouletting between stamps of the same pane.

\$2.00 Small Game - Black on green. From vertical booklet panes of 5 (1 x 5) measuring  $47\frac{1}{2} \times 190$  mm including  $14\frac{1}{2}$  mm tab at top. Roul  $4\frac{1}{4}$  between stamps positions 4 and 5. All other rouletting including between top stamp and tab is  $5\frac{3}{4}$ . Some position 2 stamps have incomplete "1964" at right. Some position 3 stamps have incomplete "1964" at left. Defective top frame line on some position 3 stamps.

\$2.00 Wild Turkey - Black on pink. From vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) imperf all 4 sides,  $48 \times 174\frac{1}{2}$  mm. All rouletting is  $5\frac{3}{4}$ . Incomplete "1964" at right on some stamps positions 1 and 2 and at left "1964" on some stamps from position 3.

\$2.00 Spring Wild Male Turkey - Black on deep yellow. Red serial number, black year dates. From vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) imperf all 4 sides,  $48 \times 178$  mm. Large rubber stamped numerals indicate specific areas of validity.

Type 1 - Roul  $6\frac{1}{4}$ .

Type 2 - Perf  $11\frac{3}{4}$ .

\$7.50 Big Game - Black on deep yellow. From vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) imperf all 4 sides,  $48 \times 174\frac{1}{2}$  mm.

Type 1 - Roul  $4\frac{1}{4}$  between stamps positions 1 and 2 and 4 and 5. Roul  $5\frac{3}{4}$  between all others. Incomplete "1964" at left on some stamps positions 2 and at right "1964" on some stamps position 1.

Type 2 - Perf  $11\frac{3}{4}$ . (Worn equipment was responsible for large holes and small sharp pointed perfs on some stamps.)

\$7.50 Eastern Deer - Black on green. From vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) imperf all 4 sides,  $47\frac{1}{2} \times 174\frac{1}{2}$  mm. Roul  $4\frac{1}{4}$  between stamps positions 1 and 2. Roul  $5\frac{3}{4}$  between all others. Incomplete "1964" at right on some stamps positions 1 and 2 and at left on some stamps positions 2 and 3.

\$7.50 Antelope - Black on blue. From vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) imperf all 4 sides,  $47\frac{1}{2} \times 174\frac{1}{2}$  mm. Roul  $4\frac{1}{4}$  between stamps positions 4 and 5. Roul  $5\frac{3}{4}$  between all others. A few stamps are known from panes roul  $4\frac{1}{2}$  between stamps positions 1 and 2. Incomplete "1964" at right on some stamps positions 1 and 2 and at left on some stamps positions 2 and 3. Large rubber stamped numerals indicate specific areas of validity.



1964 Resident Hunting Stamps

- \$7.50 Archery Deer - Black on pink. From vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) imperf all 4 sides,  $47\frac{1}{2} \times 174\frac{1}{2}$  mm. Roul  $5\frac{3}{4}$  between all stamps. Incomplete "1964" at right some stamps position 2 and at left some stamps position 3.
- \$7.50 Archery Antelope - Black on light yellow. From vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) imperf all 4 sides,  $47\frac{1}{2} \times 174\frac{1}{2}$  mm. Roul  $4\frac{1}{4}$  between stamps positions 4 and 5. Roul  $5\frac{3}{4}$  between all others. Incomplete "1964" at right on some stamps positions 1 and 2 and at left on some stamps position 3.

1964 Non-Resident Hunting Stamps

All designs same as 1963 stamps. All year dates and serial numbers in red.

- \$25.00 Small Game - Black on light yellow. From vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) imperf all 4 sides,  $76 \times 254$  mm. Roul  $4\frac{1}{4}$  between stamps positions 4 and 5. Roul  $5\frac{3}{4}$  between all others.
- \$35.00 Big Game - Black on green. From vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) imperf all 4 sides,  $48 \times 174\frac{1}{2}$  mm. Roul  $4\frac{1}{4}$  between stamps positions 1 and 2. Roul  $5\frac{3}{4}$  between all others.
- \$35.00 Archery Deer - Black on white. From vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) imperf all 4 sides,  $48 \times 174\frac{1}{2}$  mm. Roul  $6\frac{1}{4}$  between all stamps.

MISSOURI TROUT STAMPS AVAILABLE AT DISCOUNT - These are offered, in mint condition, at a reduced price for one year from the expiration date or until the supply is exhausted. All unsold stamps will be destroyed one year from their expiration date. The 1969 stamp which had a face value of \$3.30 went on sale Jan. 1, 1970. Expired stamps are offered at \$1.00 each, a sheet of 10 for \$8.00, or \$25.00 for a book of 50 stamps (5 sheets of 10 stamps). Orders should be directed to: Fiscal Section, Missouri Department of Conservation, Box 180, Jefferson City, Missouri 65101. A bank draft or money order in the correct amount made payable to the Department of Conservation must accompany all orders.

KANSAS TOBACCO - This tax was declared unconstitutional. Stamps??

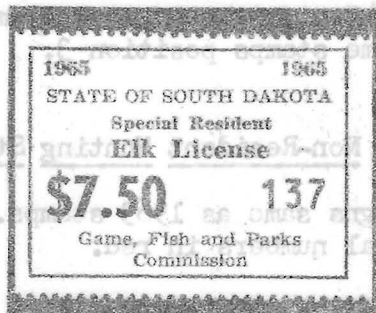
PENNSYLVANIA TROUT - Art Soderling shows us a letter which indicates that the 1963 trout stamps are still available at \$1 each. Orders should be sent Bureau of County Collections, Miscellaneous License Division, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Harrisburg, PA 17127. They do not have remainders of any other year.

MISSISSIPPI TOBACCO - Charles Hermann has obtained some more roulette varieties. It appears that the roul 5 varieties are being phased out in favor of roul  $5\frac{3}{4}$  all four sides. Collectors will appreciate this as the roul 5 was too coarse and resulted in lots of torn copies.

MARYLAND LIQUOR - Chas. Hermann has a copy of the 1/10 pt purple with Goldstein signature overprinted in blue with 4 lines across old value and "1/5 GAL" in two lines over seal.

\$2.00 Spring Wild Male Turkey - Black on blue. Black year dates and red serial numbers. From vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) imperf all 4 sides, 48 x 178 mm. Large rubber stamped numerals indicate specific areas of validity.

\$7.50 Big Game - Black on pink.

\$7.50 Eastern Deer - Black on deep yellow.

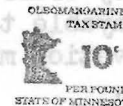
\$7.50 Antelope - Black on light yellow. Large rubber stamped numerals indicate specific areas of validity.

\$7.50 Elk (first year of issue) - Black on yellow. Printed text only.

\$7.50 Archery Deer. Black on blue green.

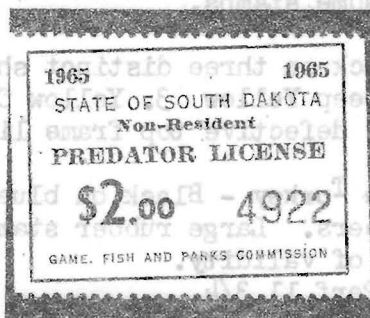

MINNESOTA OLEO - This has again been changed and Charles Hermann provides copies of the new and past issue for comparison. Note that on the new issue (1969) there is a serif on the "1" in "10". The lettering has also been slightly rearranged, the map appears to have a heavier outline, etc.

\$2.00 Predator (first year of issue) - Black on white. Printed text only. Year dates in black and serial numbers in red.

\$25.00 Small Game - Black on green. From vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) 76 x 267 mm including 14 mm perforated tab at top.

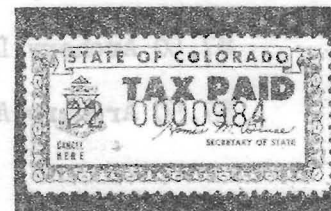

\$35.00 Archery Deer - Green on white.

COLORADO LIQUOR - Rusty Morse shows us a previously unreported stamp. This is a green "TAX PAID" with Bruce signature. The tax paid was not covered in the article by Overman and Pruess so it seems appropriate to give the serial numbers:

Bruce signature, red numbers 0000130 - 0001995

Baker signature, black number 0002050



Can anyone tell us the use of these stamps? Rusty says he has a 5¢ green of the last Baker set with serial 0005621. Thus far no lower number has been reported for that stamp and he wonders if the taxpays might have been earlier experiments (there was no official differential tax rate for miniature liquor prior to Baker's last term.)

Rusty has also narrowed the gap for the Bruce to Baker transition, to wit:

1966 Resident Hunting Stamps

All designs same as 1965 stamps. All year dates and serial numbers in red except as noted. Except as noted all stamps are perforated 11 3/4 and from vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) approximately 48 x 187 mm including perforated tab at top. Worn equipment was responsible for large holes and sharp pointed perfs on some stamps.

\$2.00 Small Game - Black on three distinct shades of paper as follows:  
1. Yellow 2. Deep Yellow 3. Yellow Orange. Many stamps from position 3 have defective top frame line.

\$2.00 Spring Wild Male Turkey - Black on blue. Black year dates and red serial numbers. Large rubber stamped numerals indicate specific areas of validity.

Type 1 - Perf 11 3/4.

Type 2 - Is known rouletted 4 1/4 and 5 3/4. At least a portion of the panes used are known to have had both gauges rouletting on the same pane. From vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5). Other pane detail unknown.

\$7.50 Big Game - Black on green.

\$7.50 Eastern Deer - Black on light yellow.

\$7.50 Antelope - Black on pink. Large rubber stamped numerals indicate specific areas of validity.

\$7.50 Elk - Black on blue. Black year dates and red serial numbers.  
Some panes are double perforated between stamps positions 4 and 5.

\$7.50 Archery Deer - Black on light yellow.

\$7.50 Archery Antelope - Black on white.

1966 Non-Resident Hunting Stamps

All designs same as 1965 stamps. All year dates and serial numbers in red. All stamps are perforated 11 3/4 and except as noted are from vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) approximately 48 x 187 mm including perforated tab at top. Worn equipment was responsible for large holes and small sharp pointed perfs on some stamps.

\$2.00 Predator - Black on white.

\$25.00 Small Game - Black on white. From vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) approximately 76 x 267 mm including perforated tab at top.

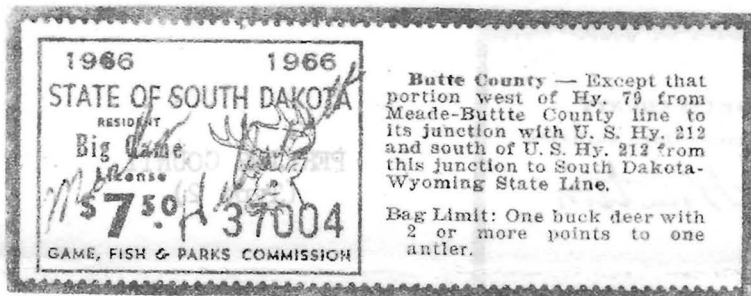

1966 Resident Special Deer Hunt Stamps

Different stamps were issued on a drawing basis for special hunts in an unknown number of specific areas. All stamps are black on green, red serial numbers and year dates, 95 x 35 mm overall with design at left side identical to the regular 1966 \$7.50 resident big game stamp. 50 mm space at right has printed text describing area of validity, bag limit, species and sex of deer legal to take in that particular area. All stamps are from vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) 95 x 187 mm including 12 mm selvage at top. Perforated 11 3/4 between stamps and at top selvage.

Information concerning any varieties not listed is solicited.

\$2.00 Small Game - Black on green. Printed text only - no design.

Type 1 - Bold face serif type serial number.

Type 2 - Gothic type serial number.

\$2.00 Wild Turkey - Black on pink.

\$2.00 Spring Wild Male Turkey - Black on blue green. Black year dates.

Red 4 mm high Gothic serial numbers. Some panes are imperforate between top stamp and tab. Large rubber stamped numerals indicate specific areas of validity.

\$7.50 Big Game - Black on light yellow.

\$7.50 Eastern Deer - Black on pink.

\$7.50 West River Prairie Deer (first year of issue) - Black on deep yellow. Whitetailed buck's head.

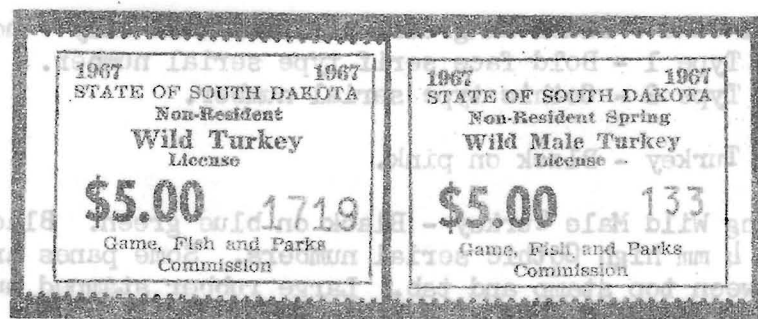

- \$5.00 Wild Turkey (first year of issue) - Black on light yellow. Printed text only. Black year dates. Red 4 1/2 mm Gothic type serial number.

1967 Non-Resident Hunting Stamps

- \$5.00 Spring Wild Male Turkey (first year of issue) - Black on pink.  
Printed text only. Black year dates. Red 4 mm Gothic type serial number. Some panes are imperforate between top stamp and tab.
- \$25.00 Small Game - Black on deep yellow. From vertical panes of 5 (1 x 5) approximately 76 x 267 mm including perforated tab at top. Red bold face serif type serial numbers.
- \$35.00 Big Game - Black on white. Red 4½ mm Gothic type serial numbers.



- \$35.00 West River Prairie Deer (first year of issue) - Green on white.  
Whitetailed buck's head. Red 4½ mm Gothic type serial numbers.
- \$35.00 East River Archery Deer (first year of issue) - Green on white.  
Red bold face serif type serial numbers. Non-resident archery deer stamps were used by rubber stamping them "EAST RIVER ARCHERY". The Game and Fish Dept. states no non-resident Archery deer stamps were issued without rubber stamping.
- \$35.00 West River Archery Deer (first year of issue) - Same detail as East River Archery Deer listed above except rubber stamped "WEST RIVER ARCHERY".

WASHINGTON CIGARETTE TAX STAMPS - M. E. MATESEN

As reported in the January 1969 Newsletter, Washington required all licensed distributors to stamp cigarette packages with a heat applied fuson type decal instead of the PB meter ink impressions beginning December 1, 1968. There was speculation that the blue water transfer decal which was in use at that time, would not be influenced by this new ruling, but they were completely discontinued in only two months after this new ruling went into effect. The first heat fuson decal issue had a red background with black lettering "WASHINGTON" in curved panel at top, state seal center, "20" at base with "CIGARETTES" beneath, usual red safety. These are issued in rolls of 30,000 each as are most of these decal type stamps. Commencing in October 1969 these red decals were phased out and replaced by one with a yellow background; both are identical with the exception of color. This is the only cigarette tax stamp currently in use in the state. The taxation rate is 11¢ per package.



## TEXAS REVENUES

Jeff Crown reports two additional varieties of the Texas Malt Liquor Stamps as listed in the STATE REVENUE NEWSLETTER 70:72. The 24-7 ounce stamp is listed as slot perf 6 3/4 x black roul 9 1/2. The unreported variety of this stamp is slot perf 6 3/4 on all sides. Likewise the reported variety of the 24-12 ounce stamp is listed as black roul 9 1/2 while the unreported variety is slot perf 6 3/4 x black roul 9 1/2. The finding of these unreported varieties raises the question as to the presence of more unreported stamps. Additions to this question will be appreciated.

An unreported liquor decal of TYPE B - 21 cents with no decimal point - has been found (see Sept. 1969 State Rev. Newsletter).

In November 1969 the state cigarette tax was raised to \$7.50 for cigarettes weighing less than 3#/1000 cigarettes (15¢/pack). In accordance with this change in the tax rate, the Texas Cigarette Meter is now printed in red and the fusion decal in blue with no change in the design of either.

Texas liquor decals and wine case stamps are no longer appearing and it can be presumed that Texas has switched to a reporting type method similar to that used for beer for collecting this tax.

Current Texas Mature Citrus Fruit Stamps can be obtained by writing the following: Mrs. Joe Eidson, Texas-Federal Inspection Service, 521 Nebraska, San Juan, Texas.

By the way I have never seen mentioned in the Newsletter the liquor stamps used for the International Bridge. I have seen the following values: 1 pt. - .21 Cents, 1/5 gal. - 33.6 Cents, Qt. - 42 Cents. (Ed. note - The latter is probably the stamp reported by Hubbard on page 13, Jan. 1970 Newsletter. Charles Hermann says it has been in use a long time. Now we know why they don't show up too often since they are used only on liquor brought into Texas from Mexico.)

## TEXAS CIGARETTE METERS

Jeff Crown and Carter Litchfield have compiled a list of cigarette meter numbers for Texas. These come in the two designs illustrated. The first design appears only in magenta, the second appeared first in magenta (M), then black (B), green (G), and now red (R). The green ink appeared in many shades.

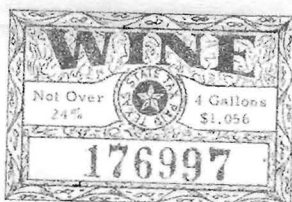

TEXAS NOTE STAMPS - Charles Hermann has discovered a second set of these. His early ones (cancelled 1937 to 1941) read "NOTE STAMP" at lower right. Stamps cancelled from 10-31-41 through early 1942 read "NOTE STAMPS". While the catalog reads "Repealed 1941", it is obvious that usage extended into 1942. Charles has the 10¢, 30¢, 80¢, and \$2 in the second type. Other denominations could well exist in this type and are worth looking far as neither set is overly abundant.

Only a small contribution would have filled this space!

TEXAS STOCK TRANSFER - Charles Hermann says he has the 3¢, 15¢ and 30¢ without position number. From the central location of the serial number, he believes the early printing didn't have position numbers. Thus there may be two varieties of each denomination.

# COLORADO CITY CIGARETTE STAMPS - Based on reports from Terry Hines and

Rusty Morse

Except for scattered notes in the Newsletter, little has been published on these stamps since Hubbard's 1957 catalog of U.S. Municipal Revenue Stamps (State Revenue Journal 3, Nos. 2 & 4). Terry obtained a current list of cities having this tax from the July 1969 TMA TOBACCO TAX LETTER, published irregularly by the Tobacco Merchants Association of the U.S., and supplemented this with another list provided by the same organization. Russell Morse compiled a list of the stamps which are known and provided the illustrations. No stamps have yet been reported from many cities with this tax. Some probably have only the combination meters, but this needs to be confirmed. In several cases stamps have not been reported in proper denominations to pay the current tax. There may either be new issues or, in some cases, the old stamps are still being used. All mention of stamps being "listed" refer to Hubbard's catalog.

## UTAH LIQUOR SEALS - M. E. Matesen

Designed in the shape of the state, this seal has a black roulette on grey safety card, with yellow background and green lettering, reads: "UTAH" upper left with state seal in center, "LIQUOR CONTROL COMMISSION" at base. These seals are required to be affixed to all liquor bottles (except the mini-bottles) sold in state controlled liquor stores. Mini bottles only have the "Less Than 1/2 Pint" Series 111 federal liquor seals affixed. This Utah decal has been in use for several years.
